Chairman's Column

A big thank you to the many residents that got involved with the Big clean on 17th October. It doesn't matter how much or what you were able to do, it all helped to improve our local environment. The Parish Council would like to make this an annual event and we are aware that it needs to be properly publicised well in advance and will find better ways to do this in future.

One very disappointing aspect of the Big clean which both surprised and disappointed many of the volunteers was the amount of Dog Poo which is still contaminating our village. More than a dozen examples were found on the footpath from Farm Close road to Station Road alone. Those Dog owners who selfishly allow their pets to continue to create this unsightly mess cannot possibly be unaware of the serious health hazard that it creates, particularly for young Children. Farm Close Road Rec



As we adapt to the second lockdown you will be glad to hear that the parish owned play areas at Church Rd, Cullum Rd and Farm Close Road Rec are able to stay open. This is even more poignant as the improvements to Farm Close Road Rec have been completed. The new train inspired multi-play and 4 seater springer have been welcomed by our younger members of the community. For anyone who is unsure where this site is, it is off the footpath between Farm Close Road and Kelham Hall Drive.

We do ask that everyone who visits the play areas follows the COVID-19 guidance notices on display, so that we can keep each other safe.

This project is being delivered by Wheatley Parish Council with financial support from South Oxfordshire District Council.

Community Bus Update

After many meetings and some delays caused by COVID-19 we are now keen to move the project forward and the next steps are to form a Community Bus Management Committee. So, we are now looking for people, from the community to step up and join us. Whatever your experience, background, or availability we would love to hear from you. Wheatley – Littleworth – Horspath – Cowley Centre Bus service for 2021

Oxfordshire County Council have secured some funding to run an hourly bus service from Wheatley, through Littleworth and Horspath to Cowley Centre. Full details will be available soon, but the service will start early 2021 and will run until at least October 2021. Buses will operate under COVID secure guidelines and concessionary bus passes will be accepted.

Wheatley Neighbourhood Plan Report



Wheatley NP passed Government Examination, January 2020 with modification. Whitehall (and Covid) postponed NP Local Referendums to 2021, but all successfully examined NPs now have statutory authority. The Examiner highlighted two matters beyond our control.

Robert Jenrick reserved the OBU Appeal for 500 homes at Holton Park to his own decision.

He also reserved approval (on Inspection) of SODC Emerging Local Plan, 2034, the statutory setting for policies and decisions.

On 23 April, OBU was granted outline planning permission for 500 (as opposed to 300) homes at Holton Park (1). On 02 November, the Inspector ended Public Consultation on his comments on Emerging Local Plan (2).

Summary:

a) WNP Committee scientists (D.Mancey/A.Parsons) collaborated with SODC Forestry Officer re Holton Park trees 2017-19. We request greater account of trees beyond TPOs. Wheatley and Holton PCs should continue our collaboration with Forestry in updating TPO list up to development.

b) WNP request absolute transparency about '500 homes', still described even in Inspection as 'at least 500' and 'approximately 500'. The original SODC figure, 'at least 300', criticised 31 May 2016 even by SODC Planning chief, generated ambiguity and serious mistrust for more than two years.

c) WNP welcome Inspector's Climate comments, but local evidence and growing motorway proposals contradict them. Noise pollution is not being tackled. Mill Green site (2017, 60

homes) wooden fencing is inadequate to shield from the A40(M). East of that, the A40 is embanked and exposed above Wheatley. Our Evidence Bases prove impact on village homes. Two pandemic lockdowns highlighted the noise norm. However, SRAT 14 development demands bund protection from the A40. The inconsistency is unethical and makes for an unprotected village. The A40(M) appeared in the late 1960s, before the London-bound M40 complex began its present growth.

d) Air Pollution. 500 homes on Holton Park allows a calculation of 1000 vehicles. The A40 passes and in part cuts through Holton Park on route to the M40 and the J8A Service Area which is open to district roads as well as to the MWay. Mr Jenrick stated in his Appeal verdict, 23/04/20, that future Holton Park homes will help commuters wishing to use the Oxford-Cambridge Expressway. As yet, this is unmapped and has low public profile. The de facto result is a growing motorway complex enmeshed with a new and further-enlarged major roadside development. Wheatley has a conservation area and its local limestone buildings now show disintegration through pollution.

e) We address the Inspector's 'integration of communities'. WNP formally describes STRAT 14 as 'close to Wheatley but isolated by its own landscape.' It is connected by a narrow B-Road [Waterperry Road] and a flyover which is half a century old. We describe the serious concerns of the community. We are not a NIMBY Neighbourhood Plan and have supported village 'enhancement'. We welcomed formally the new residents of Mill Green. We stuck to the letter of the law that we do not pronounce on or research traffic until we pass Examination. We acknowledge the government decision for 500 homes at Holton Park. However, we demand that its impact on roads, traffic, noise, pollution, and basic connectivity, be clarified and resolved explicitly as a matter of urgency.

The History File

Homes Fit for Heroes—and a request



A light plane flew from Essex this summer to photograph Wheatley's 50 'Homes for Heroes' (1927) on the elevated side of London Road and on its rising Avenue, all nearly a century old. (He photographed well). Wheatley Urban District Council (1896-1932) heard Sanitary Inspector reports every month. Polluted water, unfit homes, human and animal waste flooding together, Typhoid, Diphtheria and Malaria, meant villagers being sent to Abingdon Isolation Hospital. Housing reform was overdue, and not just for returning soldiers. Government subsidised and loaned; new homes had maximum green space and right-through daylight; real architects had to be employed for quality. Eight houses only [4 semis] could be built on rural acres, but WUDC made it 6, [3 semis] and the difference shows. Before 1914 the 'Garden Suburb' movement set housing standards.

Pioneers like Cadbury, Rowntree and Sunlight Soap built model homes for their own workers. In 1928, WUDC discussed naming its proud development. but Government warned they might have to sell off the new homes privately. A national economic slump threatened. Naming was dropped and tenants quickly recruited, including nearly 20 veterans.



I have lived opposite the 1927 houses for nearly 50 years and learned about them from friends there. This summer, between Lockdowns, several residents have told me about themselves, their houses and family memories. Others have asked to meet after Lockdown, to chat – and show the old well, the original fireplace, the generous garden. johnfinbarrfox@gmail.com. I can be a good listener! Should the centenary be remembered, and even marked?

News from OLL

From mid-August, our worshipping community resumed with social distancing – and we were delighted to have the opportunity to attend Mass and receive Holy Communion again; our services regularly resulted in a full Church with its redesigned maximum capacity of 30. We were delighted to welcome two new families in the area and even to celebrate the Baptism of our newest parishioner, young Arvin. Renewed lockdown came as a great disappointment.

However, the Parish is active in other ways: a film crew visited the Church for a piece about our work with Recycling for Good Causes (www.youtube.com/watch?v=plGtyjI7sxw). As part of our Live Simply award from the Catholic Agency for Overseas Development (CAFOD), we collected old mobile phones, cameras, jewellery, unwanted foreign currency etc, and sent items to be processed

to recover precious metals, the proceeds going to CAFOD for its important work overseas.

The usual CAFOD Harvest Fast Day was held but donations were made by contactless payments and by text, with the Parish Live Simply Book of Recipes and Tips, published last year, featuring in a nation-wide CAFOD zoom meeting over a simple lunch.

Close links with the newly established Laudato Si' Research Institute at Campion Hall ([LSRI.campion.ox.ac.uk](https://lsri.campion.ox.ac.uk)), enabled us to join four Down to Earth seminars on the changes we should make in our post-Covid world. Through dialogue between academic thinking and those on the ground in the midst of the trouble, the institute focuses on care for creation, our common home, and the poorest and hardest to reach communities in our unequal world.

From the Vicar

All the usual things that make for a good celebration of Jesus' birth are just not going to be possible. Parties and gatherings of family are out; hundreds of people crammed into church to sing carols is out; travelling across the country to meet up with Grannies and Grampas is out. So what are we going to do?

The Bishop of Oxford has suggested that we shift our focus beyond Christmas and look forward to Easter. This might sound a little crazy, but it may help us see Christmas as a 'stepping stone' along the way, rather than the culmination of the year. Having shifted our focus we can enjoy whatever we can do at Christmas without the burden of expectations of a 'normal' Christmas.

In all of this we will all need patience and a good measure of hope. There is encouraging news that various vaccines are showing positive results in their trials, but they may still be months away from being delivered to you and me. In these last few months I have often thought of the folk who lived through the second world war and who had to endure years of uncertainty and wondering about the future. They endured with patience and the 'Dunkirk spirit' and ultimately all was

well, but the end of the ordeal was not clear cut – even once the war was won rationing and austerity continued as the cost of war became apparent. At St Mary's we are making plans for Christmas services, but we are mindful that our plans may have to change at short notice. As I write we are planning a Christmas Carol service on Zoom only on Sunday 20th December at 6pm. Then on Christmas Eve at 4pm, again on Zoom, there will be a family Christmas service at 4pm, followed at 10pm by our first Communion of Christmas on Zoom AND in church (but you will need to book your place. Christmas Day will have two Communion services at 8am and 10am, both on Zoom and with a congregation in church (again you will have to book your place).

Please look out for the Wheatley Area Churches Christmas Card for details, and keep up to date with our plans on our Facebook page.

Whatever you do this Christmas, may you know the joy of the shepherds, the exhilaration of the wise men, the contentment of Mary and Joseph and the peace of the Christ-child, and may God bless us all at the end of this extraordinary year.

Library Refurbishment

Wheatley Library has had a make-over!



After delays due to the pandemic we have completed the work and are back on track to an improved layout and décor in the library.

The new layout provides a more open and accessible space. The old metal shelving has been replaced with nearly new wooden shelving (previously used in a temporary Oxfordshire Library whilst the Westgate development was underway) including a dedicated wooden display unit to showcase books in a more attractive way to customers.

Moveable shelving means that the southern end of the library will be better suited to host community events, including those run by the Friends of Wheatley Library. Some other items of furniture have been replaced, including a more compact desk for staff which increases floor space, and new seating, including soft seating for the children's area. The library has been given a fresh coat of paint and a new carpet to complete the look.

We want the library to be welcoming and open to all; a place for connections and communication, pleasure and practicalities. The library should be somewhere that everyone can come with confidence to spend time in a safe and comfortable environment.

The library refurbishment has been funded by money allocated to the library from various housing developments in the area and a contribution towards the costs of the decoration made by the Friends of Wheatley Library.

We hoped to have a re-opening date to include in this article by time of going to print but due to national restrictions during November, we are not in a position to give an unequivocal date. Keep an eye out online or at the library itself for notices about an opening date.

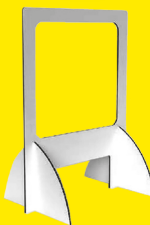
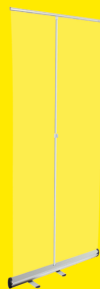

The days are getting shorter but there still seems to be plenty to do in the garden. I have recently taken on half an allotment, so that is keeping me very busy! At least my back garden should be kept free from quite so many pots next year.

Things to do in December and January

This is the best time to carry out essential maintenance in the shed or greenhouse (cleaning pots, making repairs) and to plants and trees in the form of pruning. Pruning can also lead on to taking hardwood cuttings which can be inserted straight into spare space in the garden. Keep picking winter crops and check any stored overwintering plants such as dahlias. In January, rhubarb could be covered for an early crop. Think about wildlife, making areas for insects such as log piles or bug hotels, keep feeding birds and ensuring a supply of water. Best of all, this is a great time to plan what to do for the upcoming year. Even Covid 19 can't stop us dreaming!

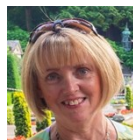

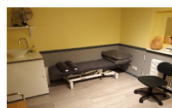

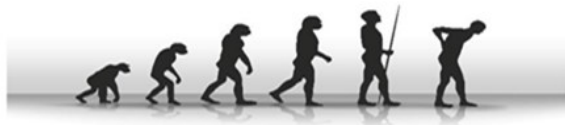

ASDA Wheatley Community Update

October has been one of my busiest months with a number of fundraising activities planned and delivered, before we entered our second national lockdown at the start of November.

A store tombola was run on Friday 16th October with all pink prizes raising over £150 from customers and colleagues for one of our National Charities, Tickled Pink, which raises money for two charities: Breast Cancer Now and Coppafeel. This has been our first in-store manned fundraiser for a number of months, so I was keen to get back into doing what I love.

Additional measures were put in place such as selecting tickets for those taking part to reduce others touching the kit and tickets, and to maintain social distancing. Masks were worn at all times, as well as kit and hands being sanitised on a regular basis. It was also my first chance to use our newly delivered card machine, which means for any activity we hold, we can now offer a cashless transaction with contactless payments. It is set up to donate to specified causes each month period. Coin collections are still used.

We also welcomed the Royal British Legion to our store to collect for the Poppy Appeal. Roger Bell and his team were in store for 1.5-hour intervals from 9am to 7pm daily in the foyer. I wish to thank all those that have generously donated to all our in-store causes, as supporting our community at ASDA is something we are incredibly proud of.

I was delighted that the ASDA Foundation and ASDA jointly funded an additional £250 in-store monthly budget to support free school meals

over half term, in response to the Marcus Rashford campaign.

Food banks is one of the ways many families can receive support in times of need for food to feed themselves. In total, we donated 4 trolleys of food to three Oxfordshire food banks which were distributed over the half term through the community emergency food bank, Oxford Mutual Aid and Sharing Life Trust, who have all seen an increase in demand.

Other donations in the last two months include supporting Wheatley Primary School with their main fundraiser for a school sponsored walk. We provided 250 pieces of fresh fruit for their mid- way snack. The school are also running a Breakfast Nurture club for which we have donated cereals, bakery items and fresh fruit in the recent months.

We have seen a number of schools and other groups looking to fundraise for Christmas planning to run socially distanced online raffles, so we have provided donations and wish them every success with their fundraising. Rest assured we will continue to do our best during these uncertain times to serve our community.
