Wheatley Playing Field Trust

News from The Trust

The Trust has carried out some pitch maintenance and improvement during the Easter holidays. These included deep -tining the whole field and applications of weedkiller and fertiliser. In addition, the floodlit training pitch has been reseeded and top dressed with sand. We would ask everyone to keep off this pitch.

Other pitch restoration includes making good the wear and tear in the football goal mouths. Unfortunately, much of this work has been spoiled by unauthorised users of the field, dragging the goals back onto the pitches. We ask that the goals are not moved onto the pitches to allow them to recover.

The Trust is looking to re-align the rugby pitch during the summer. Some 30 years ago the pitch was moved when it was thought that an access road was going to be built from the Forest Hill turn to the Holton turn. Putting the pitch back to its original position will help reduce the confusion created by the numerous lines of the running track cutting across the pitch.

The tennis courts are available for use by residents of Holton and Wheatley for community use outside school hours. We would ask that users complete the form on the Trust website to let us

monitor numbers and to accept the terms of conditions for use. Unfortunately, there has been some damage done to the nets and posts recently.

There are some events taking place on the playing field this Spring and Summer. The dates are as follows:

- Wheatley FC 5-a-side tournament 21st May,
- Wheatley Oaks women's football festival 25th June,
- Wheatley Play Day 16th July.

An additional event taking place on the playing field is the Community Picnic, organised by Wheatley Parish Council, to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee on Sunday 5th June from 12pm to 3pm.

Studying the Scriptures

Although the Church of Our Lady of Lourdes is open daily for private prayer, the principal service of the Eucharist is held only once a week; Sunday Mass is celebrated each Saturday evening at 6pm and is known as the Vigil Mass. Daily Mass and three Sunday Masses are celebrated at our main Parish Church of Corpus Christi in Headington.

Although the Liturgy of the Eucharist is thought of as the central part of Mass where bread and wine are consecrated and received as the Body and Blood of Christ, it is not often realised that the Liturgy of the Word is an essential first element which enables a study of the scriptures over a three-year cycle. This year, after Easter and Pentecost, we are studying the Gospel of St Luke, with readings each Sunday preceded by related readings from the Old Testament and the letters of St Paul.

Luke is often given the title scribe of the gentleness of Christ, portraying Jesus as an immensely compassionate and caring person. At this time of the year, we enter the travel narrative and look at the positive qualities required of the followers of Jesus – dedication, charity, the spirit of prayer together with vigilance and humility (Luke Ch 9 – 14).

The Liturgy of the Word always includes a sermon, or homily, in which Fr Mervyn, himself a recognised scripture scholar, assists us interpret the meaning of the word and apply it to our everyday lives before we express our faith together in reciting the creed. The Liturgy of the Word concludes with prayers of the faithful: for the Church, the world, those in difficulties and the local community.

Over a three-year cycle, we cover the three synoptic Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke; the Gospel of John is covered in the most solemn parts of the year, Lent and Easter.

Visitors are welcome to join our growing community at Our Lady of Lourdes.



An SJCT spokesperson says the home will provide opportunity for employment, living, and social engagement in the Wheatley community and its residents will benefit from landscaped gardens and state-of-the-art facilities, including a bistro café, fitness suite and private dining room.



ASDA Wheatley Community Update

Our store ran two events during March and April, one on Mother's Day and one as an Easter Egg tombola raising £212.11. Our recent UNICEF coin collection held on our checkouts raised £120.81.

We would like to give our heartfelt thanks to everyone that continues to provide such community support despite challenging times. We really do live and work in a fantastic community here.

By the time this is printed, we will have started our next round of green token giving, which will run from 1st June until the 30th September. The causes for this vote will be Wheatley Windmill Preservation Society, Friends of Horspath, and Thame District Guide Association. Our next grant round for Empowering Communities and U18 Better Starts reopens in June, so please get in touch to discuss further.

Words from The VPA

Hopefully, the fear of frost is now behind us, and we can plant out all those flowers and vegetable plants we have been nursing along under cover.

June

Tender bedding plants, hanging baskets and containers can now go out. Watering will become a regular task but try to restrict this to containers and any new plantings. The weeds will also be coming on apace, so regular hoeing and handweeding needs to keep up. On the plus side, salads and early potatoes can be harvested. If you have a lawn, then no doubt mowing has become a weekly job. Forsythia and other spring-flowering shrubs can pruned into shape. If you are lucky enough to have a greenhouse, then you may need to add shading.

July

As summer is now well under way, deadhead flowers regularly to keep them blooming. This is a good opportunity to get up close and see what other jobs need doing. Unless you plan for marrows, keep picking



the courgettes! As last month, water wisely. If you spot apple or pear scab, remove any damaged twigs and leaves to minimise spread. Lawns will benefit from a feed around now. Remove blanket weed from ponds. If you have time to put your feet up, order catalogues for next year's spring bulbs!

There was no speaker in March but we welcomed Jane Finnerty, our Group Advisor. The monthly meeting was followed by our Annual Meeting. Our president of five years, Janet Walsh is standing down. After a ballot, with Jane Finnerty acting as teller, Steph Cox was voted in as our new President. Jan was thanked for all the hard work she has put in to keep our Institute going. It hasn't been easy but thanks to various projects undertaken by members, Zoom meetings and the unfailing dedication of Jan and the committee we are still a thriving Institute.

The meeting was followed by refreshments and a quiz.

April saw the first meeting chaired by our president Stephanie Cox. We welcomed Rosemary and Dennis Edginton, volunteers with the Hearing Dogs for Deaf People. They were accompanied by their hearing dog Teaka. The charity trains dogs to alert deaf people to important and lifesaving sounds they would otherwise miss sounds that many people take for granted like the doorbell, alarm clock and even danger signals like the fire alarm. Being aware of these sounds makes a real difference to deaf people's lives, and can even save their lives in the event of an emergency. It takes about two years to fully train a hearing dog during which time they live with a volunteer trainer. A hearing dog and their deaf partner need to be carefully matched to ensure the partnership will work well. When training is completed they are then matched with a deaf person so the dog's skills and personality suit their lifestyle.

Many deaf people feel isolated so these dogs provide love and companionship as well as giving them their independence and a sense of freedom. We learned that it costs £20,000 to train a hearing dog so it's a charity that needs support.

History Snippets: 1922

A charabanc was hired for a June outing to Bournemouth at a cost of £15.5.00 for the day. Members would pay 10/6d each and other who wished to join them would pay 12/6d. A meeting in June was held in the Vicarage garden and 25 members from the lckford Institute were invited. After the tea games were played and a tug-of-war arranged between the two institutes! The competition was an article made out of an old stocking.

A fete was being held at Shotover in July and Wheatley ladies were running the tea stalls. We must be very good at this as we are still being called on to make cakes and serve tea at various events.

Our meeting on 21st June will be an evening when we learn about the art of chocolate making, plus tastings. On 19th July two of our members will be leading a craft evening.

Meetings are held in the Merry Bells beginning at 7.15 pm. A donation of £2 is suggested for visitors. Do come, perhaps with a friend, to give us a try.

YOUR Wheatley Village Archive

additions to the archive Welcome continue to be donated and following a talk, in April, on entertainments in Wheatley over the years to the British Legion, some photos were kindly received illustrating their activities. We are also now the proud custodians of first log book of Wheatley the Secondary School from its beginning in 1950 until Fred Anson's retirement in 1972 when the primary school took over the premises and the secondary school moved to Holton Park. Kevin Heritage's book about these 22 years can be obtained in the village.

A walk around Holton Park led by Kevin Heritage has been provisionally booked for all those interested on the afternoon of Sunday 3rd July at a cost of £2. If you are interested do contact michael@wheatleyarchive.org.uk or phone Steph on 07979 867014 for more details.

We recently welcomed Helen to the archive team. She has started a "One Place Study" on Wikitree based on Wheatley which is a world-wide family tree with contributions, like Wikipedia, from individuals. Additional contributors (there are already some) are welcome but it is very important that any family tree additions are robust and well supported by sources in order to

maintain the integrity of these trees. Do check it out on the link at the bottom of the page.

The archive team have chosen photos of celebrations in Wheatley over the years for a village calendar for 2023. Our calendars in 2019 and 2020 were very popular and the new one for next year will be available later in the year. It will go well with a copy of "Wheatley 1890-1910: Reminiscences of the Turn of the Century and a Snapshot of the Village in 1910" which is a popular new addition to the village bookshelves for £7.

Soon after I joined the archive team, I was volunteered to transcribe local parish registers onto an Excel document to help searchers. These transcriptions, baptisms 1851-1963, and burials, 1813-1985, are now complete.
