Chair's Column

As I sat and wrote this on Remembrance Day morning, paused to reflect the selfless acts of bravery in two global conflicts, subsequent wars, and the fight for freedom by the Ukrainians, which sadly is having global consequences. Our digital age makes the photographic evidence of brutality an everyday occurrence and the danger is that we all become desensitized to suffering and the troubles of others. As we approach the Christmas holidays, we must all make an effort to be kinder towards and our friends and neighbours. Being nice costs nothing but is tremendously valuable.

I would like to thank Gareth Morris for organising the British Legion collections this year, it is incredibly important to those who are in receipt of their support.

During the last period, your Parish Council have continued to address parking issues in the village through Cllr Ramsdale's chairmanship of the Traffic Working Group. I understand that OCC are not going to address our High Street parking issues for another 18 months, which is disappointing as we have given them our data, but we will continue to work on it and try to improve things.

All of us on WPC have undertaken to complete training in Civility and Respect this autumn. As a councillor, we adhere to the 'Nolan Principles' which are the basis of ethical standards of Public Life, but your council have gone a step further and signed up to the Civility & Respect Pledge which is a project overseen by the National Association of Local Councils to call out bullying, harassment and intimidation in local government.

We hosted the Village Volunteer Awards in October to acknowledge the contributions made by people in their own time to improve the lives of others in our community. It was a really good event, one which we will continue to do annually, and we look to our community members to nominate deserving recipients when we launch next year's event in May 23. I do make a plea — we have a Young Persons Award, for which we had no nominations last year. Please can local organisations take a look at their young people and recognise their inputs into our community. It means a lot to the recipients.

Finally, I invited some members of an organisation called Summix down to talk to a group of councillors about the proposed 'Harrington' New Market Town. The proposal is for a new development on land near Milton Common, the Haseleys and Tetsworth and is seeking to provide 6500 homes with green spaces, shops, schools, medical facilities, and transport links. It is early days but both myself and the Vice Chair Toby Newman thought it important to be briefed by the Project Team to understand the impact on our village. It also gives us the opportunity to influence on behalf of rural communities. The meeting went well, and we will stay in touch to ensure Wheatley and the surrounding area is part of the developers thinking.

I hope you all have a merry and peaceful Christmas and a Happy New Year.

At our November meeting we accepted and approved the documentation for the Wheatley Neighbourhood Plan Review and have submitted these to SODC. We await to hear more about any future consultation or referendums that may follow in the coming months

At the same meeting the council reviewed the draft budget for 2023-24, looking at its own increased costs and proposed projects for the coming years, whilst aware of increasing financial pressures for many residents. It acknowledged that it would difficult decisions to make December, when it agrees its final budget and the precept (the small element of the council tax that goes to the parish council.) This discussion will take place at our monthly meeting on Monday 5th December. These meetings are held in public, and you are welcome to attend to hear what is discussed and agreed.

Traffic Hints #2 - Parking on Pavements

In the last newsletter we provided some information about parking on pavements, when it is illegal and the risks thoughtless parking presents to pedestrians and other road users. In this newsletter we use some examples of parking around the village to highlight the risks.



Here a car and a van have parked in the High Street on double yellow lines, completely obstructing the footpaths for pedestrians, buggies and mobility scooters. The only way past is to step into the road. However the van is obscuring the view for other drivers and therefore doing so is dangerous.

PLEASE, if you are parking in the high street use the designated spaces or the Merry Bells or King & Queen

carparks. (Please be aware that the Merry Bells has a 2 hour limit and the King & Queen car park 4 hours during the day).

Here a car is parked by the sharp corner in Ambrose Rise. It is obstructing the pavement so buggies and mobility scooters can only get past by going into the road. However, this is very dangerous because of the blind bend. The car is also parked within 10 meters a junction which could obstruct the vision of drivers coming out of the side road.





Meanwhile, on the other side of the road, a car is parked completely blocking the pavement on a blind bend.

If you are parking your car on a pavement, PLEASE ensure that you leave plenty of room for pedestrians, buggies and scooters to pass

and that you don't obstruct other road users or park within 10 meters of a junction.

Finally, if you are parking outside the Primary School please don't park on the double yellow or zig zag lines. They are there to protect pedestrians, including children going to school.

Wheatley Neighbourhood Plan Report



Pre-Submission Documents following PLAN REVIEW: Nov. 2022.

The Draft WNP Review (0.3) was formally presented to Wheatley Parish Council by its WNP sub-Committee Chair and vice-Chair [JF / RG], 14 November 2022, to be forwarded to SODC. Eight [8] pre-Submission documents from experts and community members accompanied it:


- 1. First Review Version, WNP-R (0.3)
- 2. Wheatley Character: 1918 population now quadrupled; how to protect village character.
- 3. Site Selection: Home ownership possibilities; Local 'Enhancement'; WHE 14,15,16 & 22 are 4 out of 32 sites assessed by WNP 'Land Use Workshops', 2016-17. They are the heart of the WNP.
- 4. Housing Need:- [acknowledged with LP 2035, Dec. 2020; the LP allowing a rate of 22 homes p.a. is validated by this current Local Plan. No OBU building has yet begun.
- 5. Viability Appraisal Refresh Study:— Housing & Commercial sites now independent (WHE 15 from WHE 17); most recent legislation now clear Biodiversity; Future Homes Standards; Benchmark Land Value; CIL and Building Cost rises, etc.
- 6. Strategic / Environmental Assessment:— Air Quality Climate Change Noise (growing issue) Heritage Community Well-Being Land Soil & Water.
- 7. Basic Conditions Statement:— all WNP Policies to match local and national polices (e.g. LP 2035 & NPPF) biodiversity gain due to be required soon from new building. Reducing legal conflict smoothes way for 'sustainable development'.
- 8. WNP Consultation Statement:— 7 weeks outcome from consulting WPC / HPC, Statutory Bodies, Community individuals and Community Interest Reps.
- 9. Design Codes / Guidance:- sourced from WNP/SODC/Chilterns/Homes England/Extensions & Modifications. Overdue, but broadly sourced.

Draft WNP was **minimised** Feb. 2020 on Examiner advice. Green Belt proposals were removed to avoid a political block beyond our control. December 2020 the block was removed when the new SODC LP 2035 was allowed. It allowed a necessary Green Belt policy specific to the WNP for required and affordable housing. The **minimised** WNP could then be **'Made'** in 2021 and then **'Reviewed'** this year (2022). The draft version of this 'Review' here proposes to **restore most of the pre-February 2020 detail, and to amend and update that original version of WNP submitted to the Examiner in late 2019. With updates, expert advice, and community Consultation, it is now being forwarded for 6-8 weeks SODC Consultation. Afterwards, it will be returned to WPC with comment and criticism for the final WNP Review. It is thought likely that a final Referendum will have to be held.**

We know our SODC planning advisers well after so many years, and we believe the trust and respect is mutual.



The Merry Bells Village Hall

When moving from their office in The Merry Bells to their new home in the Library, Wheatley Archives found a picture of Dorothy Miller, the original driving force behind The Merry Bells.

'It is one of the finest buildings of the kind to be found in any country village in England and was a gift to the Parish of Wheatley by Mrs (Dorothy) Miller of Shotover House.' So wrote the Oxford Chronicle & Berks and Bucks Gazette on February 18th 1893 when describing village societies' meetings and activities taking place at the Merry Bells following its formal opening in 1888, when described as 'a large and commodious building known as the Merry Bells Coffee House.'

Further described as a 'generous gift of a lady who is an ardent worker in the cause of temperance, who has borne the entire expense and commendable motives which prompted her action has been the improvement of the social condition of the labourers of the village and the spread of temperance principles.'

Times have changed but the Merry Bells remains as a facility and meeting place for Wheatley and the wider community today following its sale to the village on 3rd August 1970 for £10,000. The first meeting of the Trustees as the Management Committee took place on the 25th August, with the final instalment of the purchase price being paid six years later and the Trustees immediately set about a programme of 'modernisation and repair.'

Today, the principles of providing a modern and equipped facility for the village remain

with the Trustees under the Trust Deed, and it is their duty to use any surplus income on maintaining the building. One of Dorothy Miller's principles was that she was 'very anxious that the building should be so organised and so patronised that it would become self-supporting,' which it remains today. Back in 1888 there were rooms to be leased and rented, as there are today with the Main Hall and offices upstairs, while there was originally a lending library with 400 volumes situated in what is now the Coffee Room (also available for hire), with books being able to be borrowed for six pence (5p) per week. Of course, today our modern library remains upstairs in the Merry Bells having been taken over by OCC.

Finally in 1888 Jackson's Oxford Journal wrote: 'to inaugurate the opening of the premises (Merry Bells) the labourers and their wives of Wheatley and Littleworth and those working on the Shotover Estate were invited to partake of a free tea provided at the Merry Bells., it is the intention of the current Trustees to offer the same hospitality and much more in 2023 to celebrate more than 50 years of the village owning the Merry Bells. More details in the next Newsletter issue.

As our September meeting was held the day after the Queen's funeral a minute's silence was held and we sang "Jerusalem", the W.I. hymn, in her memory. Her Majesty had been a member of Sandringham W.I. for 79 years. We staged an exhibition of royal items and members' reminiscences of being in her company were shared. This was followed by our members' show. There were five categories, including the competition for the Val Targett Cup. Val was a long standing member of our institute and many will remember her as a much loved teacher at Wheatley Primary School. The cup was presented to our institute by her husband and each year a cake baking competition is held in her memory. This year's winner was Veronica Lancashire. Many thanks to Geoff Coleman of Cornfields Bakery who judged our culinary classes. Other categories were decided by the members' votes. A cream tea was provided by the committee. The meeting closed with the singing of the national anthem in honour of our new king (making sure we got the words right!).

We organised a collection for the Oxford Emergency Food Bank which was very well supported. At the beginning of our October meeting Elaine Parsons, a representative from the food bank, gave a short talk on the charity and how it is run. Donations collected at Wheatley Churches, Asda and the Co-op all go towards this worthwhile cause. This was followed by a "Bring and Share" harvest supper. A magnificent savoury buffet prepared by members followed by a variety of delicious desserts. A lovely social evening enjoyed by everyone.

History snippets Dec/Jan 1922

In 1922 there were two W.I. meetings a month, one held in the afternoon and the other in the evening. In December of that year neither institute held a Christmas party. One meeting held a lecture entitled "where our food comes from". The other meeting wasn't much better with a demonstration on re-covering a sunshade followed by the singing of folk songs. Why not Christmas carols? However in January the afternoon group held a social evening. Every member was entitled to bring along one adult guest and 102 people attended. A charge of 6d was made to include refreshments. The evening institute had a talk on Constantinople.

One item of interest was brought up by the committee and the following letter was written to the parish council. "In view of the public danger and inconvenience caused by the dark streets the committee of the Women's Institute request the council to consider the possibility of lighting the existing street lamps during the winter months." The W.I. is still very pro-active in challenging local and national issues.

At our meeting on the 13th December we will be entertained by the Launton hand bell ringers and on 17th January we will be having "Fun and Fitness" with Michele Jacobs. Gentle chair exercises to do at home and hopefully help lose some of those Christmas pounds.

Our meetings are held in the Merry Bells beginning at 7.15 pm. A donation of £2 is suggested for visitors. Do come along and give us a try, you will be made most welcome.

- Search "Royal window" For those who missed it, Turner Properties devoted their entire window to a very patriotic display of photographs of the late Queen.
- Search "WW2 records" With Remembrance Day just gone, many of you will have seen the wonderful display of poppies at the entrance to the Merry Bells. Amongst the poppies was a sparse list of names of people who took an active role in the Second World War. The village is keen to try and emulate its book from WW1 "They were a Wall" with a similar one for WW2. Details of such villagers are sparse, and we would be very pleased to hear from anyone with any information on a family member from Wheatley who was involved in WW2.

How Many Days of Christmas?

Towards the end of October, 60 days before Christmas, we visited a garden centre which was festooned in Christmas glitter, rather incongruously described as Winter Wonderland, given the 21°C outside. It prompted the question: when does Christmas begin and end?

At OLL, we begin preparations on the first Sunday of Advent (27 November), this year focusing on Matthew's Gospel reminding us to stay alert and prepare the way of the Lord. But if Advent is a period of preparation for the birth of Jesus, when does the Christmas season end?

We often talk about the Octave of Christmas – the 8-day period from Christmas Day during which we continually celebrate the birth of Jesus who was to become the Christ, the anointed one (from Greek Christos). So in some traditions, Christmas lasts for 8 days which coincidentally ends on New Year's Day. More traditionally, we talk and sing about the twelve days of Christmas beginning on Christmas Day and preparing us for the Epiphany, on 6 January; Twelfth Night is the eve of the Epiphany, the feast commemorating the visit by the three Kings to the baby Jesus in Bethlehem. In many countries, this is a time for great celebration and the exchange of gifts; an opportunity to prepare and eat King Cake, often prepared with a hidden plastic baby inside. Whoever gets the piece with the baby is brought luck... or in some traditions, has to prepare cakes for the next feast day, the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, held on 2 February. This is Candlemas Day, sometimes called the 40th day of Christmas.

So whenever we start to get into the Christmas spirit, October, November (the Village Christmas Fair) or December, we should add 8 days, 12 days or 40 days, to the celebration of the birth of a child born in poverty over 2000 years ago. At OLL, we will mark that birth with Mass of Christmas Day at 10am on Christmas morning.

The first for £2.500 from the Councillor Community Grant is towards the cost of purchasing and installing a non-turf cricket wicket. The Trust had to remove the original one, alongside the cricket square, when its condition had become deteriorated.

Wheatley Festival Needs You

Taken from the publicity for the Wheatley Festival in the 1970s/1980s

A further meeting to discuss the possibility of resurrecting a form of the Wheatley Festival will take place on:

TUESDAY 10th January 2023 in the coffee room of the Merry Bells at 7.30pm.

The Wheatley Festival came out of the Silver Jubilee Festivities of 1977. The Festival ran from 1978 to 1987, over the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of the Spring Bank Holiday. Up to thirty different events were programmed – from Children Sports, Tug-of-War, Rounders, Aunt Sally, Littleworth v Wheatley Football Match, Art Exhibition, Pram Race, URC Fete, Community Plays, Music Events, Societies Fair, Poems and Pints and culminating in a Street Ceilidh (Barn Dance) outside the shops on the Monday Evening. These events were usually organised by either individuals or village organisations with the Festival Committee coordinating the programme.

Since 1987 there have been numerous 'one-offs', usually to celebrate the late Queen's Jubilees or milestone birthdays.

The intention isn't to replicate the festival, but to have something more low-key over just one or two days perhaps. But even this would need organising. Therefore, if you, as an individual or as an organisation, would like to offer your services in putting on such a programme or have ideas on what might take place, please come along on the 10th January 2023.



Our Local Garden Club

The nights are drawing in fast now and curling up on the sofa looks ever more attractive! If you are trying to save on heating, throw on some warm clothes and thick socks as there is plenty to do outside. Even in the depths of winter there will be things to see. Clematis Jingle Bells looks delicate but will flower from November to February.

December and January:

Planting new trees and moving shrubs can go on now until the beginning of March. This period is also perfect to take hardwood cuttings of your favourites. Freestanding apple and pear trees can be pruned throughout December and January but make sure you shape up acers, vines and birches before Christmas and their sap gets on the move. Continue to check any garden structures can withstand wind and weather. Greenhouses and pots will need to be cleaned in readiness for 2023's planting. Keep checking on any stored tubers such as

dahlias. Lawns do not need much attention but can benefit from wormcasts being swept off. Many of us garden indoors too so be careful not to overwater houseplants.

As we enter the new year, we can think about forcing some rhubarb for an early crop and we can also plan what vegetables we want to grow and where. Peaches trained against a wall are best protected from fungal disease by providing a temporary shelter from excessive wet weather.

Just as we need to look after ourselves during the winter, remember birds and wildlife too. With bird flu around, feeders need to be washed regularly. Finally, remember to recycle Christmas trees!

Sanctuary Hosting

This group organises short term accommodation for asylum -seekers in peoples' homes. They described their work at a public meeting we held in May. They are looking to merge with Asylum Welcome which will give them more certainty.

The Home Office

Recent national news has highlighted the hostile climate and at the same time the utter failure to process asylum applications in a timely manner. Outstanding claims stand at 100,000 compared with 6,000 in 2010 – despite arrivals falling by almost a half (Oxford University Migration Observatory). So, it was heartening to hear that the Refugee Study Centre at Oxford University is working with others and the Home Office for a new approach.




