Wheatley Annual Parish Meeting Minutes 11th April 2022

The meeting was held in the Merry Bells and Chaired By Wheatley Parish Chairman Alison Sercombe., with the Clerk (Michelle Legg) present to take the minutes.

Members of Public: Approx. 20 in total including parish councillors A Cooper, R Harding, D Lawrence, T Newman, P Ramsdale, A Sercombe (Chair), L Tully, P Wilmott, and M Legg (Clerk).

The event was opened to public at 7pm to find out about parish council initiatives ahead of the formal meeting that began at 7.30pm and closed at 8.33pm

- 1. Cllr Alison Sercombe welcomed the community to the meeting.
- Minutes from Annual Parish Meeting 2021 were approved and signed as a true record of the meeting.
- 3. Cllr Sercombe gave a precis of the annual parish council report that was available to attendees and attached to the minutes.
- Clerk update main points covered in the council report. Those in attendance were given an update on the Community Larder project, which will hopefully launch in the next few months.
- 5. Update from South Oxfordshire District Council Cllr Alexandrine Kantor, gave a brief update, including attending a meeting at the pavilion to discuss the project to redevelop the site.
 - Looking forward to hearing the responses from the High St parking consultation. Reminded those present that there is support for those who are having financial issues or are vulnerable.
- 6. Update from Oxfordshire County Council Cllr Tim Bearder no update as Cllr Bearder was not present.
- 7. Open Floor and Q & A Items raised.
 - Village Square seating questioned the quality of the work. The council are working with contractors on this.
 - Farm Close Rd planting area weeds. Site is to be maintained by the parish council as part of its seasonal activities.
 - HGV's on High St Asked for an exclusion notice for the one-way system or Holloway.
 - Other issue raised around HGVs in general using the village as a cut through. Residents can report concerns over HGV's to Trading Standards (OCC).
 - The parish council are re invigorating the Traffic Working group and will be focusing on Littleworth Rd, illegal parking and HGV's.
 - OCC Cllr Bearder should be approached to deal with OCC issues.
 - Several residents thanked the parish councillors for their work. One in particular asked whether there were more ways in which councillors can engage with the community.
 - The parish council meets every month and meetings are available to the public,

councillors hold parish surgeries twice a week, edit and produce a newsletter sixtimes a year and have an online presence.

Anyone interested in becoming a parish councillor is urged to come forward and to speak to the Chairman or the Clerk.

- Resident offered to assist with raising the council's profile.
- Resident asked about jubilee events. The working document was on display at the meeting and would be confirmed nearer the event, and available in the next Wheatley News.
