If you have visited Church Road Recreation Ground in the last couple of months you will have noticed metal fencing in front of the cliff. I will start with some good and timely news for this area. 100% of all children due to start primary school in September in Wheatley County Division have been allocated a place in their first choice of school. (That compares to over 91% getting their first choice of school countywide and over 98% getting a school that they had in their list of choices.) I am sure we wish all those local youngsters a happy and successful start to their formal education.

The news is improving for the two main areas hit by budget cuts – buses and Children's Centre. Heyfordian who have been providing the 103/104 service will be continuing to run a bus service in the area, as a commercial venture, and we are all grateful for that positive outcome. It is clear that Heyfordian have been very proactive in offering this service. Some of the buses will link Forest Hill and other villages north of the A40. It is even more the case that we must use these bus services or lose them as if they cannot run commercially they will disappear. The service will commence in July.

Some better news for the Maple Tree Children's Centre is that it will now be receiving funding from the County Council until next March. This gives a better chance to get alternative plans in place.

You will have heard of the issues around having a single tier of local Government instead of having both a district and a county level. The main reason to do this in my opinion should be to get savings sufficient to enable local Government in Oxfordshire to once again properly fund the services upon which we all depend. An informal independent report last year said that the biggest savings would be found in a single Unitary Council covering the whole County – a route that a number of Counties are now taking. The Districts, who wish to see four unitary councils, are not considering the single unitary option in their consultation. This is why, with regret, the County is having to undertake a similar consultation on a number of options.

WHEATLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN John Fox, Chairman WNP Committee

We distributed WNP leaflets in Wheatley and Holton during April, presented our project to the Annual Parish Meeting (20.04), and welcomed over 100 to our first Open Day (07.05) who left us opinions, ideas and concerns in writing we are now analysing (12.05). These include 40 completed initial questionnaires, with three open questions on how people currently see their village. These are now being distributed more widely as part of our role in listening to residents' feelings about our community. So far 28 'Street Reps' have volunteered to deliver and collect initial questionnaires to and from 20 neighbours each: many more needed and warmly welcome! Wheatley has 1600 homes and 40 Street Reps, for instance, could contact half the village directly. Housing and Land Use are our core mandate, including options for the Brookes site after 2021. In September SODC will publish its allocation for new housing here, currently forecast to be around 180 homes. We will then turn discussion and consultation to the pros and cons of various sites - and other possibilities.

A very good year was reported on at the AGM on April 21st. Highlights included the Summer Fayre held last June aimed at promoting the Merry Bells and bringing the community together which was a huge success.

WHEATLEY RED KITE SURVEY

Sien van der Plank, MSc Biodiversity, Conservation and Management student at the University of Oxford

On Sunday 21st February a group of the Oxford University students came to Wheatley to find out what the community thought of red kites, the large raptor of the British Isles with the distinct forked tail. Since red kites were reintroduced to the Chilterns in the 1990s and spread out successfully, they have received

varying responses. The focus of our studies is management and conservation and thus we were eager to find out what Wheatley thinks of red kites. The Wheatley residents were extremely kind and keen to help, as a result of which we were able to get feedback from over 60 households.

Background stakeholder interviews carried out in advance of the survey of Wheatley suggested there may be some individuals concerned about conflicts between red kites and small pets or children, as well as that people may not be used to seeing such a



large bird in urban areas. However, Wheatley residents were by and large very positive about the presence of red kites in their area. Nearly everyone surveyed knew what a red kite looks like, and they were described as a spectacle, eerie, part of nature, peaceful and much loved.

The main concerns about the large bird included its potential to exclude other wildlife from enjoying the area and its defecating habits. Nonetheless, the survey suggests Wheatley residents take an interest in red kites and feel positively about it; they feel the bird belongs in Wheatley. The big question that the community may have to consider in the future is: if the population increases to unacceptable levels, what would the preferred management response be, if any?

Once again, many thanks to all those who took part in the research!



THE HISTORY FILE: Housing Issues, 1650 John Fox

In the 1600s, houses were measured by their hearths, not their bedrooms. In 1665 Wheatley Manor's 12 flues proclaimed its tax. An unheated room was useless, and heat came only from fireplace or warming pan. (Today's elderly remember bedtime in a 1940s -50s winter, yet 1800 years ago, the Roman villa above Wheatley had underfloor heating). In the 1700s they taxed windows (and householders bricked them up). Today they tax 'spare' bedrooms. Wheatley Manor (12 hearths) was bigger than Waterperry House (9), but not Holton House (18) on its damp moated island. Waterstock House was palatial (23). Most of Wheatley's 90 one-chimneyed cottages were exempt. 'Town houses' on High Street returned much tax, like modern 'semi's. They also changed timber fronts for stone, when Wheatley [High] Street suggested black-and-white Stratford. Illegal building boomed with population rise after 1600 – a quick-build on any space, or a legal build omitting the extra green space demanded with every newbuild. The Wheatley Constable had discretion. A house of upright and cross timbers, with wattle, was easily built. It needed post-holes, but little foundation, therefore few have survived. It was easily dismantled, as 'up sticks' reminds us. In 1653, during England's Republic, Thomas and Joan Plot put up their 'sticks' on wasteland (common land), but were reported. The Wheatley Overseer for the Poor stayed an eviction, awarded them 10 shillings a quarter, and on their death allowed their daughter to 'up their sticks' for herself. Wealthier people with new extensions, but who failed to add more green space, had to demolish.


WHEATLEY FILM CLUB - NEW VENUE! David Bendor-Samuel



WHEATLEY SOCIETY - VISIT TO VIRIDOR AT ARDLEY Christopher Sprent

On 10 May a party from the Wheatley Society visited the Viridor Energy Recovery Facility at Ardley which occupies the impressive new building close to the M40



south of Jct 10. This privately funded £225M facility, which operates under a 25-year contract with Oxon CC, consumes 95% of all the non-recyclable (black bin) waste generated in the county and in doing so produces sufficient electricity to power 38,000 homes. We were briefed on and shown all aspects of this highly complex and efficient operation, taking particular note of its many safety

features, which include means of ensuring that emissions are clean and visitors are well protected! The Ardley site has produced much evidence of the dinosaurs which occupied this area some 200M years ago, the example in the photo being made from items of waste gleaned from the continuous stream of bin lorries which pass through the site.

BOB LOWRIE 01/05/1935 – 05/04/2016 Roger Simmonds, John Guy & Clive Hallett

In April, Wheatley lost one of its much-loved residents; after a year-long illness and stroke, Bob Lowrie died peacefully in Greengates Nursing Home. Before retirement, Bob was the inspirational Head of Science at Oxford School with previous positions at Magdalen College School and Malvern College, and a spell as science commissioning editor for Pergamon Press.

Born in Birmingham, he came up to Merton College following National Service as an RAF radar technician and went on to gain a DPhil in Chemistry, undertaking pioneering research in Gas Chromatography. He was Merton's 1st Eight Cox, steering them to success at Henley Royal Regatta, and he coxed the University 2nd Eight, Isis.

Bob arrived in Wheatley in 1990 with a national reputation as a tenor soloist. For 25 years he was Lay Clerk of New College Choir and directed St Barnabas Church Choir, Jericho. Latterly he sang with St Giles Church Oxford, singing in



the Vatican and coaching the boy choristers. As a member of Pro Musica, he appeared several times in The Vicar of Dibley, including singing at Alice's wedding!

In Wheatley, he sang with Wheatley Park Choral Society, visiting Grenoble, Prague, Freiburg, Menden and Japan, and was a strong member of their Madrigal Choir. He coached and wrote close harmony for the ladies' Barber Shop Quartet "Hot Wax" who sang at his bedside a week before his death.

Bob was a committee member of Wheatley Productions and appeared in G & S productions of Iolanthe, Yeomen of the Guard and the Mikado as well as in many Pantomimes. He took part in three Community operas, The Enchanted Loom, Poet & Plumber and Letters to Paola, in which he took the leading role of Narrator. His rendition of "Poisoning Pigeons in the Park", a show-stopper in an evening of Music for Spring at the Merry Bells, lives on in Village memory.

Throughout his life, Bob maintained his active association with the Scouts, rising to District Commissioner and earning the nickname "Bob-a-job"!

Bob's Memorial Service will be held in St Giles Church, Oxford, at 3pm on Saturday 2 July. May he rest in peace.


