Chair's Column

Hello everyone, its nearly Easter! Where has the time gone?

We are coming up to the local elections and I just wanted to thank those parish councillors who are not standing again for another 4-year term. You know who you are and I thank you for your service.

Since May last year your council has continued with activities in our community. Here is just a flavour...

- Worked alongside Holton Parish Council in consultation with Oxford Brookes on the proposed development at Wheatley Campus
- Delivered several Cuppa, Cake and Chat events to help combat isolation.
- Supported several village charities and initiatives.
- Initiated an annual Volunteers Awards Event where contributions can be recognised.
- Agreed our communications strategy and developed a village logo.
- Lobbied SODC and grant funders for the rebuild of the Pavilion at Wheatley Playing Fields.
- Delivered a Table Tennis table for the Recreation Ground
- Working with OCC and South East Forces Cadet Association (SERFCA) to bring the empty cadet hut back into community use.
- Worked more closely with Wheatley Primary School to be inclusive for all of our villagers young or old. We will be setting up a Youth Council in 2023-24 to support the Parish Council ensuring the voices of our children are taken into consideration. Please let us know if your child is interested in being part of this initiative.

The Volunteer Award Scheme will be launched shortly, so please do some thinking about nominating people who you think have contributed to the wellbeing of our community. Their Majesties King Charles and Camilla, Queen Consort, also wish to recognise volunteers as part of the celebrations for the coronation so I encourage you to nominate those who you feel knit the community together.

As part of the Coronation celebrations on Monday 8th May, we are organising a Local Produce Fair in the High Street to celebrate local producers, more news on that further within this edition. Please come and support local producers.

However: As a responsible dog owner, I deplore the levels of dog waste I see and plead with dog owners/walkers to carry bags whilst exercising their dogs around the village. The pavements aren't wide and the likelihood of a small child or an elderly person walking through it is high. It is very unpleasant and antisocial. If your dog defecates in the street, please clear it up. On the same topic, please refrain from allowing your dog to jump up onto the raised beds in the High Street and leave a mess. These are beds that are tended by our parish team, and in some cases by children so please be considerate.

Finally, the first signs of Spring are becoming visible – budding shrubs, signs of leaves on the trees and longer days, all helping us to feel better and top up our vitamin D!

Clerk's Column

It is lovely to be sitting writing this is the warm Spring sunshine, and to see the bulbs popping up around the village. Spring brings the close of another council and financial year, so we are busy focusing on completing the seasonal tasks including our financial statements, which will be finalised later in the year. We have also scheduled the Annual Parish Meeting for Monday 24th April, in the Merry Bells. This meeting is open to the whole community to raise any topics and will include a review of the past year, plus news on new and ongoing projects. Do come

along from 7pm, with the formal meeting starting at approximately 7.30pm.

Spring also sees the delivery of council tax bills, where you will see that the parish council has had to increase the precept (its part of your council tax) by 7.5%. The rise followed a year of 0% increase, but ongoing challenges with price increases and some key projects to support the community. This year is also the end of the current council term, and all 15 councillor seats are up for reelection on 4th May. Some councillors will not be standing, and we really need new blood to step up and represent the community. The parish council is closest to the community and best placed to work with and to support the community. We would love to have a wide representation from across the village, skills, and interests. Please consider standing and becoming a councillor.

Table Tennis

In partnership with South Oxfordshire District Council, we are pleased to have installed a brand-new table tennis table in Church Road Rec, expanding the range of activities on offer. All you need is to take your own bats and ping pong balls.

Voting ID | 4th May

For the first time voters will be required to show photo identification to be able to vote at polling stations on 4th May.

The new requirements, introduced by the UK government last year, mean that you must show ID to be able to cast your vote in local elections as well as Police and Crime Commissioner polls and general elections. Many people are unaware of this change so please make sure you have acceptable photo ID (passport or driving licence) with you when you come to vote (it doesn't apply to postal voters). If you don't have an approved form of ID, you can register for a postal vote or if you'd like to vote in person, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate – for this you only need a passport sized photo and your National Insurance Number.

Please don't lose your democratic right to vote! Applications close on 25th April.

Which forms of ID can you use to vote?

You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

- Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional license)
- Blue badge
- Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- Biometric Immigration document
- Defence identity card
- Certain national identity cards

Traffic Hints #4 - Blue Badge Parking

It seems that the incidents of dangerous, illegal, and inconsiderate in Wheatley are reducing so thank you to everyone who thinks about others before they park.

We need to make a point of clarification about parking on yellow lines. It is in fact legal when the car is displaying a blue badge (disability parking permit). So, if you see a car parked on yellow lines please check if it has a blue badge before taking any action and please be polite and respectful if you feel you should speak to the



and respectful, if you feel you should speak to the driver.

On a related topic, accessible parking spaces are for the use of blue badge holders only. If you park in one without a blue badge you could be stopping someone in need from using it and you can receive a fine.

Wheatley Neighbourhood Plan Report

- 1. Examiner Andrew Ashcroft re-joins us to help SODC examine the final WNP Review. He first led us in 2019-20, when Wheatley Parish Council (our Validating Body) had submitted our first WNP Draft to SODC. Secretary-of-State Jenrick and SODC had clashed, and Mr Ashcroft advised against anyone's guessing how long stalemate might last. WNP had observed all basic Planning Principles, but Whitehall disputed SODC Local Plan 2034. In February 2020, the Examiner advised that we remove all WNP proposed Enhancements requiring Green Belt. Littleworth alone (no G.B. involved) remained our only WNP Enhancement but sufficient to be a WNP and to be re-made ten months later (December 2020), Whitehall and SODC made peace. A Green Belt policy specific to WNP proposals was secured within a new L.P. 2035. By 2022, WNP was then draft-reviewed through consultation. It then went to Wheatley PC to be forwarded to SODC for Examination. Mr Ashcroft leads and advises on this and decides on any need for Referendum. We welcome him back.
- 2. A 'Two Week Consultation' (6-19 March) leafleted in early March without notice, has raised eyebrows and questions. WNP Committee (JF/RG) contacted the OBU Team and a prompt apology came from OBU Mark Tugwell blaming failure by consultants. I thanked him, but requested we meet to talk 'community'. It is unclear whether any of the '2 Week Consultation' responses will be shared with District Planners or with fellow community respondees. (Both are key elements of any consultation.) This 'Two-Weeker' imitates Planning Consultation, but it rings hollow and no signatory or officeholder identified with the leaflets. 'OBU and an unnamed property developer' are the stated recipients of this 'feedback on design and layout' at the site. OBU will then send 'a reserved matters application' to SODC in April, following Outline Planning Permission (500 homes) given in 2020.
- 3. OBU 'Consultation' maps show the Western entrance/exit road but say nothing of negotiating it with OBU/OCC or Wheatley Park Academy. Nor have SODC/OCC yet ruled on the Waterperry Rd double accesses/exits proposed by OBU's remote agents. Local anger peaked (Consultation, Jan-Mar 2023) in defence of a trapped part of our community whose real concerns are not seen to matter. The current 2-Week Consultation, says nothing to an entire community facing 1,000-1,200+ vehicles daily exiting and entering this site through both villages; nothing of engine noise pollution, exhaust pollution, headlight and streetlight pollution on local roads near capacity (A40, London Rd, Old London Rd, with the M40 close and hinterland traffic developing from well beyond Waterperry not forgetting OBU's para-legal 'One Miler' on the map here. This 'Two Week Consultation' smacks of contempt for real community concerns. OBU housing volume is too large for its setting. Surely, a review or enquiry is now needed.
- 4. Brookes Liaison Group: Wheatley and Holton Parish Chairpersons, (Alison Sercombe and Robert Barter) speak with one voice as Brookes Liaison Group. On 27th February they met Bidwells (Consultants) and Mark Tugwell (2 i/c OBU Trust) at WPC Office.


LitterCrew WhatsApp Group

This group of volunteers was formed just over a year ago so you may have seen members in hi-viz out and about the village. The aim is to support our two parttime Parish outdoor workers in keeping a litter deluge at bay while they get on with other jobs in the playgrounds and public areas. There are several hotspots around the village where litter is a particular problem - chiefly the High Street, the alleyway by the bakery, the Memorial Garden, London Road, Old London Road, Littleworth Road and Cooper Close footpath. At the other end of the village the footpath at the rear of ASDA is often litter-strewn. We occasionally cover Holton Turn and the various lay-bys on the outskirts of the village.

All these areas are impossible to keep spotless, so we monitor the worst areas and then go along as individuals or sometimes team up with another member when more help is needed. Many of these places have convenient bins which are emptied by Biffa up to three times a week, but it always amazes me how these are often ignored. We don't cover private premises and sometimes remind businesses such as the Co-op, ASDA, and Travelodge when there is a litter problem in the vicinity of their sites - with varying results.

If you'd like to join the Litter Crew and try to keep our village free of litter, then please contact sustainablewheatley@gmail.com. When you join you will be asked to sign a Risk Assessment and Terms of Engagement so you understand the health and safety issues when litter picking in public areas. All our equipment has been purchased with the help of a grant from our SODC Councilor and is available for members to use.

Wheatley Playing Field Trust

News from The Trust

Wheatley Park School has used the Wheatley Playing Fields at Holton for the past 50 years. For the first 42 years, the playing fields (together with the playing field on Littleworth Road) were managed the Wheatley by Park Sportsfield Management Committee, under a joint user agreement between Wheatley Parish Council and Oxfordshire County Council.

Since 1st September 2015, the playing fields have been managed by Wheatley Playing Field Trust which continues to work closely with Wheatley Park School to ensure that the school can deliver its PE curriculum.

Part of the agreement with the school is the shared use of the pitch on the school campus behind the Park Sports Centre. Up until early 2020, the Trust managed and maintained this area which included a rugby pitch and two junior football pitches. These pitches fell out of use and deteriorated during the Covid pandemic when the area was needed by the school to segregate the different year groups.

The Trust, following recent discussions with the school, will begin work shortly

to recover and restore this area so that sport can be played again on it. There is an ever-increasing demand for pitches. Wheatley Playing Fields and clubhouse are used 7 days a week by up to 450 members of the community, in addition to the students of Wheatley Park School. This takes a heavy toll on the facilities, particularly the grass pitches. The Trust is carrying out work in the Spring to further improve the field. Good, strong grass growth, with deep roots, will allow increased playing time on each pitch.

We are happy to announce the final results of our latest digital green token vote for 2022 (October - December). The vote positions with the awarded amounts are as follows:

Winning Group - £500 Friends of Beckley School

Second place - £400 Enrych Oxfordshire

Third place - £300 Oxford & District Talking News (Oxtalk)

Our current live vote continues until the end of April, at which point the scheme will be paused.

Asda's charity, the Asda Foundation, are currently reviewing the GTG programme during 2023. As a charity, they cyclically review all their programmes to ensure funding remains relevant to local community needs. We are therefore not accepting any new nominations currently for this scheme.

In the last two months, (January & February) we have welcomed three groups into our store to fundraise. A total of £1.960.44 has been raised by these groups and we hope that every penny will make a difference. We have bookings for both awareness and fundraising sessions booked in store until June. and are hoping to run a food drive later in the year as well.

Currently, we are running Tickled Pink awareness and fundraising during March to remind people of the importance of checking our chests (breast and pecs). Plus, I am planning on running a gift wrap donation station, to wrap gifts for Mother's Day and if successful, we may plan to offer this for other dates, such as Christmas. During the last two months, I have been out to a number of local community groups including girl guiding, youth groups, and nurseries to provide healthy eating sessions. I have also been to a local preschool as part of World Book Day to encourage reading and loved hearing about what the children were dressing up as!

If you are connected to schools, charities, preschools, or nurseries, please get in touch if you would like to run a session or arrange a store tour.

We are currently in contact with some local groups to discuss grant criteria and eligibility as round one of our grant offering is now open and is very similar to the format in the way of grant streams we offered last year. There will be three grant rounds for this year, where we are hoping to support groups which have not recently been supported in terms of a grant to enable us to help as many groups within the community.

At the start of February, our larger Spaces and Places Grant opened, and we had over fifteen enquiries expressing an interest in this grant. Together with our Store Manager, we met with three groups to discuss their project in more detail and are currently working with one of the groups to progress their application to the next stage.

We are only able to support one application for this type of major grant but would like to wish all the groups the very best with their fundraising to help create invaluable community spaces for groups to meet and run their activities.

Our local garden club

I spoke with some foreboding last time about what the weather might be like when you receive your copy of Wheatley News. I am writing this in March, and it is cold and snow is falling. That said, I am an optimistic soul, so am hoping for warmer weather in April and May!

April

Hopefully, we can begin to sow seeds outdoors and plant seed potatoes if they are still waiting. We do still need to be on frost-watch and protect fruit where necessary. Shrubs will benefit from feeding or mulch with compost and climbing and rambling roses will need to be tied in. The weed growth will be accelerating now so hoe if the weather is dry to keep on top of them.

May

If hedges need clipping, please check for bird's nests. Lawns can now be mown weekly but leaving some areas uncut will help wildlife. Should watering be necessary, it is best done in the morning or evening. Clumps of spring bulbs can be lifted and divided to increase their number and improve flowering. Keep an eye out for damage caused by lily and viburnum beetles and their grubs.



More excitingly, summer bedding can be planted out towards the end of the month. Keep on weeding...

FAME AND ENVY THE OPERA



In June, this year, Oxfordshire Contemporary Opera (OCO) is presenting a new opera, "Fame & Envy" a work which I have written to a libretto by Simon Kingston, another Wheatley resident. It is being performed in Thame Parish Church by six wonderful young professional singers; with a small orchestra and it is being directed by a brilliant American director Callie Nestleroth.

The story concerns the world of Fine Art and an artist of genius Florian Faber whose work, lifestyle and emerging fame arouses envy from some of those close to him. The story revolves around Florian's latest exhibition where the tensions grow among this small group of people, leading to tragic consequences.

The work is full of colourful characters plus interesting works of art and is set to vibrant, tuneful music.

This World Premiere is my sixth full scale opera, and it is a premiere not to be missed.

There have been five of my operas performed over the years in or close to Wheatley. The first two were performed by Wheatley Productions in the Primary School Hall with "The Enchanted Loom" (full of Indian costumes and dances) being the first and "Letters to Paola" (full of Russian passion and drama) being the second.

The third "Poet and Plumber" was a very funny setting of the humorous words of Kit Arnold and was produced in Wheatley Park School Hall.

Setting up the Oxfordshire Contemporary Opera company as a charity to promote contemporary opera was inspired by the production of "Lizzie Strata" in neighbouring Stanton St John. It was the first of two operas that I wrote to libretti by David Willcock. The second was entitled "@emele" and performed this time back in Wheatley again, David directed both of them.

"Lizzie Strata" like the second opera "@emele" was performed outdoors in lovely garden settings.



Emma Wilson Memorial Fund

Seeing the daffodils flowering all around the village's grass verges, it is good to see that the bulbs purchased by the Fund to celebrate the Millennium and planted by volunteers in 1999, continue to brighten up our green spaces 23 years later.

She was a pupil at Wheatley Primary and Secondary Schools and studied at New College, Oxford, until her tragic death in a road accident in the village. Grow your own fruit and veg

The Allotments are situated on windmill lane (off Ladder Hill) on a south facing hill, with a great view of the village.

The Association manages 110 allotment plots and is open to anyone in the local would who like area an allotment. Allotments vary in size, with 'half plots' averaging 100 square meters and whole plots 190 square meters. We also have a number of 8' x 4' raised beds available for those who have difficulty working at ground level and they are surrounded by paving to facilitate access. Firstly, the archive volunteers must thank those people who contacted us in connection with the plea for info on various members of the Munt family in the last issue which has been added to the website. Do remember that if searching on the website for more than one word e.g. Post Office, they need to be in quotes like this "Post Office", single words do not.

Which reminds me...after 35 years the Post Office has changed hands. Neil and Anette MacCormack completed the sale on 3rd March to Jigar Patel and photos are on our website. Thank you and welcome to all.

Do keep looking at the website as it really is a work in progress with over 700 new images and 90 new records in the last year.

The 1921 census, which is free for all to access in the county libraries, has been analysed and this summary of the 10-page report, relating to Wheatley, will give you a taste.

1921 census Summary

The population of Wheatley from the 1921 census was 918. However, based on the occupation of the houses in 1911, the enumerator seems to have missed four houses at the east end of High Street. It is unlikely that these were all empty. With a possible 14 living in these, a revised total of 932 people in 247 living units in 1921 (1901 – 872, 1911 – 966).

men folk with 17 men, who had been living in Wheatley in 1911, being killed. In four cases, these deaths appeared to have led to abandonment of their 1911 dwelling.

Between 1911 and 1921, 54% of the Wheatley population of family units (of whatever size) were still in the same dwelling. This was not a great surprise as most occupiers were tenants, presumably on short leases. Some 35% of dwellings were occupied by people new to Wheatley since 1911. 11% had moved within the village. This level of incomers is not unusual today and is even on the low side of the at least 50% of dwellings now being occupied by incomers over a 10-year period.

There were 370 people gainfully employed. Agriculture was still the largest employer (63 people), building trades and servants were the next highest with 40 in each category.

The variety and number of shops were largely unchanged since 1911. Ernest Sheldon had opened a cycle and motor agent business at 94 Church Road and Thomas Putt had become a shoe repairer.

Of the ten pubs trading in 1911, there had been a change of licensee by 1921 at White Hart, Railway Hotel, Kings Arms, Plough, and Cricketers. The Red Lion in Blenheim appears to have not been trading.

Chrism, a Royal and Sacred Oil

In March, the Chrism oil to anoint King Charles at his Coronation was consecrated at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem by the Patriarch and the Anglican Archbishop Naoum. Olives from the Mount of Olives had been pressed near Bethlehem and Patriarch Theophilos ceremonially mixed that oil with sesame, rose, jasmine, cinnamon, neroli, benzoin, amber and orange blossom, according to an ancient formula last used for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. This holy and fragrant Oil of Chrism represents the deep historic link between the coronation, the Bible ("my head thou hast anointed with oil," Ps 23) and the Holy Land.

On Maundy Thursday, Catholic and Anglican Bishops across the world will be performing similar ceremonies in their cathedrals to bless three holy oils for use in ceremonies in churches throughout their dioceses.

The Oil of the Sick, pure olive oil, is blessed by the Bishop for anointing the seriously ill. In the Catholic Church, the priest traces a cross with the oil on the forehead and hands of the sick person, often bringing spiritual and emotional peace.

The Oil of Catechumens, a simple olive oil, is blessed to anoint those preparing for baptism.

The Oil of Chrism is different. During the Maundy Thursday service, in the presence of the clergy of the diocese, the Bishop will mix olive oil, signifying strength, with balsam, representing the aroma of Christ (2 Cor 2:15). In this way, the fragrant Oil of Chrism is created and then consecrated, just as the Patriarch did in Jerusalem in March.

The Patriarch's Oil of Chrism will be carried to Westminster Abbey for the Coronation and, similarly, the diocesan clergy carry the three newly blessed and consecrated oils back to their parishes from the cathedral.

The Oil of Chrism will be used throughout the year to consecrate people to God's service; it is used in baptism, confirmation, ordination to priesthood, the consecration of a bishop... and the coronation of a king.

The Falcon School, Zimbabwe

In 2020 our Care For The World Ministerial team chose Zimbabwe among their priority areas for love and (where possible) financial support in these challenging world times.

We wanted to identify a direct cause to support with which we could develop a relationship and monitor the benefits of our efforts. We were fortunate to be put in touch with the Reverend Wilbert Sayimani who, with his late wife, several years earlier, had purchased a sandy block of land on the outskirts of Harare with the aim of building the Falcon Primary School for local children whose parents could not afford to send their children to state school.

One classroom was already almost completed in early 2021 but with funds from efforts as diverse as a quiz walk, preserve sales and personal donations we have helped purchase school uniforms, teaching resources and build both a second classroom and teachers' accommodation.

The school has 80 pupils; the younger ones now confidently 'graduate' from Early Learning stages , while a new Grade Seven class has recently been established to prepare pupils for transition to state secondary school.

Development resources are still much needed and targeted funds will need to be raised. If you think you can help the Falcon School financially please contact Wheatley URC as shown above.

The Merry Bells Village Hall

Open Day | 13th May

Discover or re-discover your Village Hall on **Saturday 13th May** and its progress from a Temperance Hotel to a wellappointed modern village hall, which also houses the Library and Parish Council Office.

In 1888 Mrs Dorothy Miller of Shotover House commissioned the building of The Merry Bells Coffee House as a Temperance Hotel. This was because at time aside from agriculture, the Wheatley's local industry was guarrying and brick-making, and it seems that the workers were prone to drunkenness! So, with the growth of the temperance movement The Merry Bells Temperance Hotel also became a community centre providing a library, various societies and clubs, such as The Pig Club and The Slate Club, as well as a meeting-place for self-improvement.

The last records of The Merry Bells being used as a hotel were in 1932 and it remained a community centre and library until it was sold to our village in 1970 and the first management committee met in August to take responsibility for sustaining its development, while operating on a 'not for profit' basis as a charity. As Trustees they immediately set about a programme of modernisation and repair, which has continued through to today, so providing a modern wellequipped facility for the village.

On 13th May from 10.00am you will have the opportunity to discover and celebrate over fifty years of village ownership including the fascinating history; the building of the extension in 1999 to house a new kitchen and modern toilets; the installation of solar panels in 2016; our modern Bluetooth audio-visual equipment, plus examples of today's clubs, classes, and activities available.

While you explore your village hall you can 'partake of refreshments', as at the inauguration in 1888; there will be activities for children; you can also meet today's Trustees responsible for the 'self -supporting' principles originally established and buy some unique specially commissioned beer from Shotover Brewery called 'Temperance'!

We look forward to meeting you on Saturday 13th May.

Community 'Coronation Copse'

The Howe Trust would like to give everyone in the community the chance to mark the event in a nature positive way - by planting a tree on The Howe!

Our aim is to create a 'Coronation Copse' in the bottom field at the bottom of The Howe. We'll be choosing species that are of particular value to wildlife - such as Cherry Plum, Bird Cherry, Hazel, Rowan, Silver Birch, Crab Apple, Whitebeam, and Alder.

£5 buys a 90-120cm bareroot sapling, plus a cane and biodegradable spiral tree guard (to protect the sapling from rabbits and deer while it grows). If you'd like to join in, then we're taking advance orders now. We will organise a special planting day* in November.

*If you are unable to plant your tree yourself, for whatever reason, then you can choose to have this done for you by one of our volunteers.

'Adopt an English Oak'

We are also hoping to plant some much larger, specimen trees and we'd like to give the opportunity to individuals, groups, organisations or local companies to 'Adopt an English Oak'.

The bareroot oak trees will be approximately 6ft high and will require sturdy staking as well as deer-proof protection measures. They will be planted across the paddocks in areas with sufficient growing space for them to reach their full size.

A £175 donation will cover cost of the tree plus the labour and materials to protect it. For an additional £75 we can also arrange for your tree to have a personalised brass plaque with your name and a short message. We are taking orders now until end July for planting in November.
