Chair's Column

In the weeks since my last update, WPC have been working with Holton Parish Council on our respective responses to recent planning permissions submitted by Oxford Brookes Wheatley Campus. This is a complicated business with so many attached reports and appendices that you need real focus to comprehend it. We would dearly love to meet the developer Crest Nicholson to discuss the site and how we can welcome the new community into our respective areas. We will have an extra 468 families coming into the area over the next few years, and we want their experience to be a positive one. I hope that Crest Nicholson will reach out to us in the next few months so we can work together.

Have you nominated someone for our Celebrating Volunteers Awards yet? The deadline is the 31st July and it would be wonderful if the village could thank all those who contribute their time and effort for others.

WPC participated in 'No Mow May' and it was a mixed experience. It was good to leave the grass to allow the pollinators to do their work, but strimming, mowing and then clearing up the long grass afterwards was unpleasant, and I would like to publicly thank our grounds operatives for their

dedication to getting on with it. Being showered with all sorts of nasty things that were lurking in the longer grass took a strong stomach.

There will be some consultations for villagers to respond to in the coming weeks/months. The first will request your views on access to the Littleworth Nature Reserve, and the second one will seek views on what villagers would like to see on Littleworth Playing Field. As a council we would like to have something for everyone, which could include a nature area, pond, seating area, nice walks, more challenging play equipment for older children as this age group is not catered for well in the village, and a pump track for children who like off road cycling. Where the field slopes down would be a natural place for an Amphitheatre (drama, performances storytelling, Completion of this project will take time, and the council will have to go for grants to make it happen, but we are determined to increase the amount of accessible green space in the village for your enjoyment.

And talking of enjoyment, as we go into a well-deserved summer break, I hope the weather remains fine for all of us – wherever we are and whatever we are doing.



Wheatley Neighbourhood Plan Report

A. An issue for Examination.

The WNP Review is under Examination, after due Public Consultation. WNP Examiner, Mr Andrew Ashcroft, has a challenge Opinion to consider from Crest-Nicholson, now the developers of the OBU Wheatley site. C-N claim that the introduction of a Design Guide and Codes [DGC] by the WNP in 2019 and again for the WNP Review in June 2022, both supported by Wheatly Parish Council {Qualifying Body for the WNP) assumes undue authority to comment on the OBU site, to which it is not entitled.

B. WPC 'respectfully addresses' the issue by letter to Mr Ashcroft, 29 June 2023.

- Wheatley Parish Council in two Consultations (2019 and 2022) published similar details, both in line with Regulations. Information was published on WPC website, in Wheatley News, and on all Parish Council noticeboards in Wheatley and Holton. As far as WPC is aware, no objections were made to either of the consultation procedures.
- 2. Following NPPF Section 12 provisions, WPC commissioned a Design Guide and Codes from AECOM, international Infrastructure Consultants. [AECOM are based in Dallas, with 51,000 employees world-wide. q.v. Wikipedia for detail.] AECOM knew that its contracted DGC was to appear in the forthcoming WNP Review. In addition, AECOM were invited to comment on the challenge Opinion submitted by Crest-Nicholson to the Examiner. Their comment appears in a letter to the Vice-Chairman of the WNP Committee [Roy Gordon] appended to the letter of 29 June from WPC to Mr Ashcroft.





- 3. Policy H1, the DGC and Policy SPOBU were not drafted with the intent to create conflict with the 2020 Permission or to the Allocation.
- 4. "WPC accepts that modifications may be required in the WNPR. It is to be expected following any Examination. If there are conflicts between WNP Review and developer proposals for STRAT14, hopefully resolution can be achieved in the Examination findings.

C. AECOM Comments.

- a) Mindful of where the site and steering group were at the time, AECOM awarded support to help ensure that any future infill and small-scale development remain in keeping with the character of Wheatley.
- b) The DGC Report was drafted to apply to growth in and around the village, but not explicitly to the OBU scheme. The note is largely correct in that respect.
- c) That said, the report does include the site as a 'character area' included in the Settlement Edge Area Type, and specifies which codes apply to this area type.
- d) That the report has not been explicitly drafted for this site, does not mean that many of the codes are not relevant for it. They are.
- e) **But** if a design guide or code were prepared to be applied to 500 homes, it would normally include more content on strategic layout, movement, street design, and block types.
- f) We would understand if the Examiner removed the site from Policy H1, but we do not think it necessary. He may suggest we put the site into its own area type (so not Settlement Edge) and specify which codes are particularly relevant to it.

D. Broader points made by Ben Castell:

SPOBU - WHE25 policy looks reasonable.

- I understand the questioning of the Green Belt, given the de-designation.
- I cannot comment on the 'process points'.
- The code or guide discussion in para 27 and from 68-78 is of no real consequence.
 It is well established that Neighbourhood Planning groups can establish DGCs and often do.

More issues await deliberation by the Examiner.





Wheatley in the 1930s

In the first of a series of three articles, a map of the central village shops has been re-created.

- West end of Church Road, butcher's shop run by Rose brothers until 1938 1.
- 11 High Street, shop run by Dungey family 2.
- 3. Hyde baker at 39 High Street
- (Between 3 & 5) Hairdresser adjacent bakery, became a hardware shop in 4. 1947
- 5. Draper's shop at 47 High Street, Walde general store from 1935
- 6. Post Office and shop at 48 High Street
- 7. 51 High Street, general store, run by Hughes
- 65/67 High Street, general store run by Bax 8.
- 9. 97/99 High Street, Harris general stores
- 113 High Street, Bob Green's sweet shop after the Chequers had closed 10.
- 94, Church Road, fish, poultry meat, and vegetables from the 1920s 11.
- 65 Church Road, Bates cycle shop from 1931 12.

Was this unusual for the time? In a comparable village study, East Meon had four bakers, three grocers, a butcher, two mills, wheelwrights, farriers, a post office, and a fish and chip shop. Clothes, boots, and shoes could be bought at one grocery shop. It even had a herbalist! Steph Cox

Our May meeting was a very social affair. Members had been asked to wear red, white and blue if possible as this was to be our celebration of The Coronation. The tables were laid with appropriate tablecloths and decorations and it was nice to be able to sit and chat while being served tea and cake by the committee. This was followed by a "Royal" quiz which certainly tested our knowledge of the royal family. Thanks to our committee for arranging such an enjoyable evening.

We had a very interesting talk at our June meeting given by Dee O'Brien who is a Chief Inspector with the Metropolitan Police Force. Dee has been in the police force for 23 years and has had a very varied career. She trained as a detective and was then assigned to the Counter Terrorist team where she undertook undercover surveillance and related some of the scenarios she had encountered doing this dangerous job. She also mentioned some of the tragic she had attended including cases murders and the Grenfell Tower disaster. There were also more pleasant times such as the 2012 Olympics, the Coronation and the Trooping of the Colour. Although security is paramount these are more joyous occasions and the atmosphere is more relaxed. She also spent 10 years as a community officer.

Her talk made members realise that, despite the sometimes unfavourable press coverage, our police do a wonderful job often under the most difficult circumstances. We should be very proud of them.

History Snippets Aug/Sep 1923:

It was decided by the committee to write to General Miller asking him to support the scheme by which the County Council would, by means of the Public Libraries Act, ensure a permanent supply of books to the villages now supplied by the Rural Libraries, which will cease to exist in 1924. The letter was to be signed by all members. I think this must have been the beginning of an established library in Wheatley. There was still an issue regarding the street lighting but the W.I. were not giving up on getting better lighting in the village.

The fete in June had been an outstanding success and it was agreed to put £25 of the money raised into War Saving Certificates. Two outdoor meetings were held. A concert was held at The Windmills on Ladder Hill in July. The August meeting was held in the garden of The Old Parsonage when a dancing display was given by the children of Wheatley School.

There is no meeting in August. On 19th September we will welcome Gary Sherwood to our meeting when we will hear about his time in the Royal Ballet.

Our meetings are held in The Merry Bells beginning at 7.15 pm. Visitors are always welcome. £4 donation suggested.

Save our Hollyhocks!

hollyhocks Wheatley's are magnificent feature of the summer landscape. When we moved here, they inspired me to buy hollyhock seeds on-line but, despite tender loving care, they withered and died. So I took some seeds from the dead flowerheads around the village sure enough, not only did they flourish but kindly breezes spread them throughout the garden. We even have a growing colony in the stony ground of the OLL car park. The Wheatley genus Alcea rosea seems to thrive on neglect - and there is no law requiring us to grow commercial hybrid versions.

Not so in the Global South. CAFOD, the Catholic Agency for Overseas Development, recently has undertaken a study which shows that, in order to gain finance from the World Bank, African countries are forced to implement laws and subsidies to provide greater access to hybrid seeds and chemical inputs. The resulting seed certification laws making it illegal for local are communities to propagate, grow, exchange and sell their own seeds.

The World Bank the measures in terms of success greater participation of the private sector in providing access to hybrid seeds and their necessary fertilisers, as opposed to measuring impacts based on poverty reduction or increased food security for poor result, major farmers. As а agribusiness companies have been the main beneficiaries, profiting from increased sales and further concentrating their control agricultural systems.

At OLL, we have recently signed a petition to the World Bank in support of the small farmers who seek simply to protect their fundamental rights to save, use, exchange and sell their own varieties of seed, and put an end to policies that limit their choice over seeds they can access. It's hardly a good comparison but imagine the outrage if Wheatley's hollyhocks were outlawed.





Our local garden club

Our weather has always been changeable and that is why we talk about it so much more than in other countries. We truly never know what to expect. Now it is also swinging between more extreme temperatures and precipitation! I suppose we have to get used to it.

August

Depending on the weather, concentrate watering only new plants and topping up ponds. Prune wisteria if not already done. Prune trained apples to restrict growth. Deadhead flowers frequently to encourage more flowers. You don't need to be advised to keep picking vegetables but do look out for seed to collect for next year. Last year I followed a tip to leave some of my old Autumn Bliss raspberry canes uncut and these gave me an early picking at the beginning of July, so I plan to do this again this year.

September

Pick autumn raspberries and dig up potatoes. As before, water carefully and net ponds to keep out falling leaves. Cover cabbages and other greens to save some from the pigeons. Clean greenhouses ready for overwintering plants. Continue collecting seed from favourite plants and divide herbaceous



perennials to get more. Plant spring bulbs except tulips which need to wait until November to avoid tulip fire.

The Merry Bells Village Hall

In recent articles about the Merry Bells, we have written about its history and how, just over fifty years ago, it became the village hall that is technically owned by the village. We say 'technically' because in 1970 when the original owner and benefactor agreed to sell the building for the continued benefit of the village, a Trust was formed to take legal ownership.

We make this point because following recent articles, we have had comments about not having to pay for using the Hall and any of the facilities and amenities, with such comments, "as I live in the village and as the village owns the Merry Bells I should not have to pay anything".

The Trust Deed specifies that a Management Committee, consisting of elected members and representatives of various user groups, be the Trustees responsible for running the building for the use of all Wheatley residents.

In 1970, the Trustees immediately set about a programme of 'modernisation and repair' and have continued ever since. So much so, that at our recent Open Day, we were able to show that in the past fifty-three years the Trustees have invested over £1 million in

installing new equipment, upgrading, and maintaining the building, to ensure it remains fit for purpose.

Which is where we started this article, explaining that while technically the village owns the Merry Bells, we do need income to provide for the continued development and maintenance.

So, we do need the village to keep hiring the Hall and Coffee Room plus renting the offices and using our village library. On another historical note there has always been a library in the Merry Bells since it was founded in 1888 for which villagers had to pay a membership fee. Thankfully today, that is one charge that the village does not have to pay. So please support this excellent facility.

Finally, the Merry Bells car park will be closed from 5pm on Saturday 19th August until 9am Tuesday 22nd August, which is slightly longer this year, as we will take the opportunity of carrying out some maintenance work this year. Please make sure all vehicles are removed by that time.





WHEATLEY-ON-SEA



What Wheatley would have looked like 160 million years ago

Can you imagine living on a coral lagoon surrounded by sandy beaches and warm tropical seas? Well, if you had lived in Wheatley 160 million years ago during the Jurassic Period you would have done just that. Wheatley was situated on the southeast portion of a circle of coral reefs stretching out to Beckley in the north and Headington in the west. These reefs were built up by many species of corals and the Jurassic ancestors of sea urchins, mussels, oysters, limpets, crinoids, and many varieties of crustaceans such as shrimp, lobster and crab that lived on or around the lagoon. As they died, their shells and bodies sank to the seafloor to create layer upon layer of calcium carbonate to form the Corallian Limestone that is now the bedrock of our village.

Over the millennia this bedrock has been covered with layers of clays, sand, Alluvial Gravel and Glacial Till (mud and rubble bulldozed by ancient glaciers). However, there are several places where you can see exposures of this Jurassic limestone. One of the best known is found at the back of the Recreation Ground and Templars Close. These were opened up when a huge quarry was dug in the 14th Century to provide building stone for many important buildings of the Middle Ages such as the newly founded Oxford Colleges such as Magdalen, Merton and Christchurch as well as Abingdon Abbey and Windsor Castle, to name just a few. Other quarries were subsequently opened in Headington, Woodeaton, Lye Hill and Cumnor. The Wheatley quarry continued to provide high quality building material known as Wheatley Limestone until last century. Many of the houses in the village as well as St Mary's Church are built of this durable and attractive rock. In the 1990s the British Geological Survey officially classified this particular type of limestone found to the east of Oxford as the 'Wheatley Limestone Member' identifying it as "shell-fragmented, biosparite grainstones interbedded with rubbly coralliferous limestones of the 'Coral Rag' facies". Corallian

limestone laid down in the same period can also be found in the Vale of Pickering in Yorkshire and in a narrow band of outcrops stretching from Wheatley down to Portland Bill in Dorsetshire.

How do we know that these rocks were laid down in the Jurassic Period? By far the most common method is through examining fossils. Limestones are not easily dated by radiometric techniques such as Carbon 14 and Uranium 235 dating. However, examining fossils found in both limestones and in radiometrically dated rocks such as shales or mudstones gives strong evidence of the age of the limestone. The shallow seas and reefs surrounding the lagoon teemed with life. Molluscs, crinoids, echinoderms (sea-urchins) and crustaceans fed off the corals.

Ammonites, sharks, fishes, pliosaurs and ichthyosaurs flourished in the warm seas. On nearby Oxfordshire estuaries and swamps ancient ornithopods such as 'Cumnoria prestwichii' and the dinosaur Megalosarus found in Stonesfield, grazed, hunted and died. They all left fossils.

Unfortunately, the outcrops of the Corralian Limestone in Wheatley, although host to an enormous variety of sea-life, are not good places to find undamaged fossils. The reefs of Templar Close, Lye Hill, and Beckley all lay on the east side of the lagoon and were exposed to open sea. Tidal movements and shifting currents flowing between the ancient Tethys and Boreal Oceans broke up the corals, shells and bones deposited in the reefs. Fragments of these fossils can be seen in the exposed cliffs as well as in the stones used for the Lock-up and the outside stonework of many of the older houses in the village - look out in particular for oyster and bivalve shells, crinoids and small sea-urchin spines. If you want to see more complete specimens go for a walk round Rock Edge Park or Magdalen Quarry in Headington. The reefs exposed there were more protected within the lagoon and you can see many good examples of fossilised reef-dwellers' remains. Compared With Last Summer

All enhanced by the suncatchers, the subtle windchimes, arbours, bird feeders, table and chairs, hanging baskets and washing lines. All those are my contribution to this wonderous mosaic this year. It means even though on the other side of the wall I have one of the busiest and noisiest roundabouts in Oxford, with its constant car horns tooting the day away, my green courtyard remains an escape to retreat to. Even in the heat of the day the green growth seems to have a cooling effect, making the hot sun more bearable.

So, where is your retreat in nature? If you don't have one, it's worth hunting one out. The rewards are immeasurable and very grounding.

Anyway, hope your garden is as lush as mine this year, and you are winning the aphid battle, or is that just me?
