We have our Volunteer Awards ceremony to look forward to, which is our night to say thank you to those who put so much effort into making local efforts run smoothly. In fact, one of the nicest things since the last newsletter is receiving some really positive feedback about the village from existing residents and visitors alike. There has been a consistent theme from all — 'Wheatley is definitely a community - there is always something going on!' That is true, but we have volunteers amongst others to thank for that.

Wheatley Neighbourhood Plan Report



This Newsletter arrives as October 2023 begins. Our Planning Examiner, Andrew Ashcroft, forwarded his 'Report to SODC on the W.N.D.P. Review, 2019 - 2035.' It is understood that a Referendum on this for Wheatley and Holton residents is 'scheduled' for 23 November 2023. (More of that for another Bulletin.)

A 'Review' gives the chance to correct a misstatement, poor wording, and add an omission. 'Review' is built into most public hearings.

WNDP was 'Made' on 20 May 2021. To include the provisions of the new Local Plan [LP2035] a first review of the new WNP was submitted to SODC on 31 October 2022. It included the Village Enhancement Proposal and Design Guidance and Codes. Consultation carried out by WPC and SODC for the WNPD Review was submitted for Examination on 24 March 2023 It also prompted Representation to the Examiner from 14 organisations, which he followed up by enquiry and personally visiting the WNPD Area.

The Examination process allowed him to conclude that the NP has a range of policies in its search for sustainable development in the WNP Area and seeks positive and sustainable development in the WNP Area. It focuses clearly on releasing land from Green Belt to be allocated for housing and mixed development. All parts of the community have been engaged in supporting it. <u>Subject to Examiner's Modifications</u>, Mr Ashcroft found that the WNP Review meets all necessary legal requirements and that it should proceed to Referendum within the Neighbourhood Area.

The Merry Bells Village Hall

In our last issue, we wrote about how a Trust was formed to represent the legal ownership of the Merry Bells on behalf of the village. The Trust Deed specifies that a Management Committee consisting of elected members and representatives of the various user groups be the Trustees responsible for developing and maintaining the building on behalf of Wheatley. Therefore, we felt that rather than be a 'faceless committee', we would in this issue provide some background about the nine volunteer members, who are registered with the Charity Commission as Trustees for the Merry Bells.

In order of 'length of service', our longest serving member is Julia Slade, who moved to the village forty years ago and became a member of the W.I. 'rising through the ranks' to become their spokesperson on the Merry Bells Committee eleven years ago and also our Minute Secretary for our monthly meetings.

For length of service, Julia is closely followed by Tim Blightman, who joined ten years ago firstly being our Treasurer and now our Chair. Tim has lived in Wheatley for thirty-four years having spent his career in

Market Research. Tim is also actively involved with Sustainable Wheatley.

Next is John Morrison with seven years on the Committee, firstly representing the Wheatley Society and then the Village Produce Association. John, who was a Church of England priest for all of his working life ending up as the Archdeacon of Oxford and a Canon of Christ Church Cathedral. Among his other contributions, John is responsible for organising the monthly check of the Merry Bells fire alarms.

John Guy moved to Wheatley in 2014 and has served on the Committee for six years and in his own words, acts as the Merry Bells 'Head Gardener' working hard to maintain the floral displays on our forecourt, which is available for anyone to meet and have a chat. John is an active member of Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church and also a committee member of Churches. Wheatley Area Another contribution to the village is that John founded Fairtrade Wheatley. In a previous life John was an Academic Research Chemist and College Principal in Hampshire.

Wheatley Playing Field Trust

Report to Wheatley Parish Council for its meeting on September 4th 2023

September 1st marked the 8th anniversary of the Trust taking over responsibility for the maintenance and development of Wheatley Parish Council's playing field at Holton.

A Joint User Agreement (JUA) was drawn up in 1973 between the Parish Council and Oxfordshire County Council, enabling school use of the Wheatley Playing Field and giving community access to the Littleworth Road field. In 2014, ODST, as academy sponsors and lease holders of the Littleworth Road field, asked OCC to terminate the JUA. The fields were handed back to the Primary School and the Parish Council on 31st August 2015. The Trust took over the management of the field from that date with a grant of £10,000 from the Parish Council of which £8000 was used to pay off existing Parish Council's liabilities.

Since signing the lease with Wheatley Parish Council on 28th February 2018, the Trust as a charity has been able to raise £50,000 of matched funding. It has spent more than £30,000 on repairs to the old buildings and a further £30,000 on improving the quality of the pitches for all users. Some of these repairs have included replacing all lighting with LED units and controls on heating where none previously existed.

As well as improving the facilities, the Trust has encouraged increased use of the playing field, developing football from mini to adult by adapting the size and layout of the football pitches to the changing needs of the teams. It also helped introduce and encourage the growth of women's football and netball where neither had taken place previously.

The Trust continually engages with all users and encourages them to respect and take pride in the facilities. To this end a primary user agreement has been drawn up, agreed, and signed between Wheatley Rugby Club and the Trust. The agreement was ratified by the RFU to allow the Trust to seek funding, when available, on behalf of rugby. Also, a long-term agreement of hire was negotiated with Wheatley Park

School and signed. This agreement guarantees that the school can fulfil its Physical Education curriculum which was a concern of WPC in 2018.

In addition to the users of the sports facilities, the Trust has encouraged further community use of the field and clubhouse. Over the past few years, there have been two 'Play Days' and a number of celebration events, including community picnics. In 2018, the Downs Syndrome Oxford group held a 21-hour sponsored walk around part of the field to celebrate their 21 years of existence. They were able to raise considerable funds and the Trust was delighted to support them.

The Trust had gained grants from OCC and SODC and more than matched these to enable a club-standard artificial cricket wicket to be put down in July to replace the original and dangerous one.

During this summer holiday, the floodlighting to the tennis courts is being overhauled and added to, increasing the area that will be available for new activities such as walking sports.

The Trust has managed and maintained the playing field for the past 8 years at zero cost to the Parish Council other than the Council's commitments under the terms of the lease. When the JUA was terminated in 2015, the Council's financial commitment could have been £15,000 to £20,000 per year without OCC support.

As required of all charities, the Trust keeps a small reserve as a contingency fund in case of any unexpected expenditure or loss of income. This resilience was proven during the years of Covid when maintenance had to be paid for at a time of little income. The Trust continues to invest funds and be awarded grants to improve the facilities.



Our speaker in July was Stephanie Walklet who, together with her husband Richard, run "Sign Together U.K." which is based in Bicester. Richard is hard of hearing and therefore had first-hand experience of the challenges faced by deaf people during the pandemic when everyone was wearing masks. Stephanie is hearing but is fully aware how isolating and challenging life is for deaf people.

Their BSL (British Sign Language) tutorial courses are aimed to enable people affected by hearing loss to lead full and inclusive lives and are offered online or in person.

Is time in Green Space a luxury?

Our gardens and green spaces are as important as our bank balance, careers, and our future. Yet it is so easy not to prioritise time out in green space as part of daily living seeing it as a luxury and not a necessity.

We often say our landscape should be 're-wilded' but in the UK however, land ownership too strongly influences how "truly wild" an area can be. Alongside re-wilding our landscape, we should be re-wilding ourselves.

The NHS see the real and true benefits of time spent out in green space on its patients and the government's Treasury Department now see the value as well. As they agree, it is good for our health, wellbeing, and productivity.

In my opinion, ongoing detachment from the natural world can slowly eat away at us metaphorically speaking, our wellbeing and life expectancy.

It can be a challenge though as access to natural places isn't as easy and inclusive as you may think. This is due to the exclusion that comes about because of land ownership and trespass laws – this will soon be made stricter. The UK public still only has legal right of access to 8% of the land and 3% of the waterways.

It's easy to see why large parts of our society in the UK don't have access to green space as not everyone can live near the 8% of land and 3% of waterways.



Are we already heading for Autumn? September saw the restarting of our programme with two events:







We can change the world – slowly!

Last April, I wrote that the world was feeling more fragile than we had been led to assume: the war in Ukraine, higher temperatures, flooding, wildfires, as well as the consequences of the pandemic, were all uppermost in our minds. 18 months on, the world feels no less fragile. In Rowan Williams' humbling words, the more secure and prosperous members of the human race "are less different from their fellow human beings than they find comfortable."

It is a time to reflect upon how we interact with the world, and how we might seek to change it. How do our actions and decisions in Wheatley impact, ripple-like, into the world beyond.

At OLL, we see ourselves not only as members of the Village community but also as members of the global Catholic Church. Pope Francis's leadership of change within the Church is based not upon how to exercise hierarchical power, but how we should respond to the cry of the earth and

the cry of the poor. He has even suggested that high-ranking church prelates in Rome should see their futures in returning to their communities as shepherds to experience "the smell of their sheep." It hasn't always gone down too well!

Pope Francis began an exercise known as the Synodal Pathway inviting parishioners everywhere to reflect upon the church and its activities, encountering each other, listening, and discerning a way forward. flowed into Parish discussions have diocesan and then national syntheses which will flow into an international Synod in Rome this month. Concerns from the impoverished global south will carry equal weight to those from the conservative north, so change is already happening. And of the 364 voting Synod participants, mostly bishops, more than 50 will be women. It may be slow, but it represents a real and welcome change for the Church - and it began in parish communities like ours at OLL.

From the Vicar

After a disappointing summer, autumn has arrived, though as I write we are enjoying a brief burst of warmth at the beginning of September.

Autumn ushers in the season of Remembrance. The Church celebrates All Saints at the beginning of November, recalling saints from every age, those whose lives give us an example of holiness to follow. Immediately following All Saints, we keep All Souls, which in some parts of the world is known as the Day of the Dead, a chance to honour the memory of loved ones departed this life. Our usual pattern at St Mary's is to have a service for All Souls on the first Sunday in November, but as our building is off-limits this year we will be coming up with an alternative plan. If the weather is good, we may gather in the churchyard for a short service and the placing of candles on graves, but dodgy weather may force us to make alternative provision. Please keep an eye out for the details as we get closer to 5th November.

Remembrance Sunday this year is on 12th November, and, as with All Souls, we are going to have to make alternative provision for our community's honouring of those who fell in conflict. We will let you know as soon as we have a plan, but the timing will be the same as usual, 3pm in the afternoon.

As the nights draw in and the weather cools, please remember to keep an eye out for those who might struggle in the colder weather, and those who will be lonely in the long hours of darkness.

Building Works at St Mary's

Over recent years we've been telling you from time to time about our plans for renovating St Mary's church and making it a better resource for the village and for ourselves. Many of you have contributed financially to the funds needed for the work, and others have made useful comments about the proposals. The covid pandemic, The Victorian Society, and the getting of permissions have all slowed the process down. We had thought that it would all have been complete by 2020!

But now we have finally signed a contract with our builders, Savvy's, and the works will start very soon. The total value of the works (with associated fees) is just over £600,000, and the projected finish is June/ July next year. As the work goes ahead we hope to keep you informed of progress.

During the works the church building will be off-limits to unauthorised persons, but the churchyard (apart from some building access routes) will still be accessible to the public. We will do all that we can to minimise disruption to the tranquillity of the churchyard, but please be patient with us for a few months whilst the works are taking place.

Our thanks go to the large number of people who have been involved, directly and indirectly, in getting us to this point. We look forward to inviting the community in to see the re-vamped building in 2024.

WHEATLEY REFUGEE SUPPORT GROUP (WRSG)

WRSG will be holding its next collection on Saturday 28th October 10.00am -12 midday. This will be at the URC hall in Crown Square. We will collect clothes, bedding, and other items, as before, for Global Aid Network for refugees in Greece, Bosnia, and Ukraine. We will collect food for Asylum Welcome Food Bank. Full details will be in posters in the village, and circulated, nearer the time.

WRSG has been supporting Afghan families housed in a nearby hotel since arriving in September 2022. We started with a party in December with a visit by Father Christmas, games, and gifts for all 56 children plus adults, food and drink. Apparently this was their first invitation into the local community. Since then we have provided regular support especially through childcare to mothers attending classes in English and other subjects to aid advancement in a very unfamiliar society. We have been impressed by the level of support provided by Asylum Welcome, local authorities, The Maple Tree, and other agencies. All families have now been rehoused, many by the MoD following the support that they previously gave to the British forces.

Following a successful showing of the film 'Flee' we plan to continue with film showings, along with informative talks on a regular basis. We also hope to compile a suggestion list of relevant films that may be watched at home.

Our local garden club

My goodness, what a month September was!

Hopefully, some warmth will still be lingering in the soil.

October

Make good use of any residual soil warmth to plant out spring cabbages. Any tender plants will need to be moved indoors or wrapped up against frost. Perennials can still be divided and it's a good time to split up rhubarb crowns. Keep on picking top fruits for storing or juicing. If you can't yourself, pick them do contact Sustainable Wheatley for help. Before winter really closes in, now is a good time to give lawns and hedges a last tidy up. Don't be too tidy - some perennials can look good in winter and they provide important homes for all sorts of wildlife.

November

This is the time for fallen leaves, but they do make a welcome addition to the soil, so leave those in borders and let the worms deal with them. If, like me, you have been storing tulip bulbs, now you can get on with planting them out, as well as pansies and other winter bedding. Protect fruit trees



from winter moths by grease banding their trunks. To minimise the risk of winter damage, prune roses, wrap any special plant pots and raise them up on feet. Whilst netting cabbages is the best way to keep pigeons off them, putting out bird food will give muchneeded help to all our wild birds.



ASDA Wheatley Community Update

As Autumn arrives, we are supporting **Breast** Cancer **Awareness** month throughout October, having in September supported a charity Zumbathon® held at David Lloyd Oxford to raise over £400 for both Tickled Pink and Dementia Oxfordshire. This was an hour and a half of energetic dance fitness routines hosted by a number of ZUMBA instructors across Oxfordshire: so many thanks to all those who volunteered to make this a huge success.

Plus, over the weekend of the 7th and 8th of October, we are holding a static bike ride in our foyer, with a team of Colleagues cycling the distance from Oxford to Cambridge. So, if you're in Store please come along and cheer us on! We have also arranged for Thame Concert Band to play in our foyer on Sunday 15th October.

Next, during November we will be fundraising for Children in Need, with visits planned to local schools, nurseries, and children's community groups in Oxfordshire. Plus, we will also be running other activities in the Store, including a Christmas gift wrap service in the foyer over the weekend of the 18th and 19th November.

As usual, at the beginning of November we will be supporting the Poppy Appeal as part of our continuous support for the local community. This is part of our regular programme of helping local organisations and during July and August we welcomed seven groups into our Store to fundraise over £1,800, including charities, who support the visually impaired, two local animal charities and Blood Bikes.

In addition, our final Grant round of the year is now open, having already

supported ten Groups in 2023, who have had successful Grant applications through the ASDA Foundation, including The Maple Tree, who I visited as part of their Family Fun session back in August. £500 was awarded to help transform the outdoor area and to purchase planters for children to grow seeds at the Centre. The children were delighted by the ripe cherry tomatoes, which they had for their snack picked and eaten from the garden.

During the last Grant round, we also supported The Sharing Life Trust in Thame, who provide Food Bank Services to rural areas in Thame and surrounding villages including Wheatley, and I have been supporting with outreach hours, as part of my role for this Group for the past two years. Sadly, the food donated to foodbanks is not stretching to meet the demand and hopefully our small grant of £500 will help the charity to purchase topup foods.

If you are planning any fundraising locally, please get in touch early to request Store donations. I will continue to try and support as many groups as possible to help make that difference to the Causes that our customers are passionate about supporting. I will shortly be planning and organising our 2024 diary, so will be planning future bookings for fundraising in our store, please get in touch.
