This was the first year that Wheatley Parish Council has taken on the event and a special thanks to Lucy Collinson (Assistant Clerk) for organising such a great community event.

New councillor co-opted but we still have four vacancies.

In October we welcome Sophi Davis to the council, who was co-opted into one of our vacancies.

Sophi is keen to use her skills and interests to support the community, especially our young people.

We still have four vacancies and would love to hear from you if you would like to join the council, in making a real difference to the village, its residents and the community. If you are unsure of our priorities, do read our Strategic Plan, or skim through the minutes of our meetings. With only 11 out of a possible 15 councillors we really do need more of you to come and join us and help us deliver them. It doesn't matter about your background (as long as you meet the eligibility criteria) the wider ranges of ages, interests and skills really is a benefit to us and more importantly your community. The commitment is a couple of hours a month, with some reading or emails in between.

The council provides training sessions, so you gain an understanding of the role of being a councillor and the work of a local council. If you want to take this further there are lots of opportunities to use or develop your own skills and to make a real difference to Wheatley.

Council business

Since the last edition we have held several public meetings. The first was well attended and discussed Oxfordshire County Council's proposals for new road markings in and around the village centre. Shortly after we held a series of sessions, explaining the Wheatley Neighbourhood Plan Referendum. We hoped you found these useful.

If you voted – thank you for taking the time to. At the time of writing the results had not been announced. But in summary a 'YES' vote will see the revised plan being our core planning document, a 'NO' vote will see us continuing to use the initial Neighbourhood Plan documents.

At the same time, we have been busy trying to balance the books and our budget for 2023. Councillors remain aware of the financial pressures' residents are experiencing and cost increases that affect local businesses and the council's functions. It is always a difficult discussion to have.

Recruiting – Play Workers / Youth Workers

The Oxfordshire Play Association (OPA), working in partnership with Wheatley Parish Council has secured funding to deliver a weekly Junior Youth Club in Wheatley.

The project is designed for Children and Young People in School Years 6, 7 and 8 (Ages 10 to 13) and will look to support them through the transition from Primary School to Secondary School.

Following a consultation with Young People in Wheatley the project will be delivered at the Merry Bells in Wheatley on an evening TBC from 6pm to 8pm.

The sessions will last for 2 hours and will be delivered weekly, we are looking for staff to work 5 hours per week (including prep, delivery, monitoring etc).

The project will provide fun and positive Play opportunities within a Safe and Supportive environment within Wheatley. This project will increase Childrens opportunities to Play and meet in a Safe Space whilst promoting Positive Activities and Behaviours, Increased Levels of Physical Activity and Healthy Lifestyles.

The Oxfordshire Play Association is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (Registered Charity Number 1160320) and has been delivering a Countywide service across Oxfordshire since 1974.

Our Vision is to 'Improve Lives Through Play'

Our Mission Statement is to 'Champion and support the rights of all Children and Young People to have access to high quality, inclusive, play opportunities to promote their physical, mental and spiritual wellbeing.'

Our new Playworkers will work 5 hours per week (2 hours prep, 2 hours direct delivery and 1 hour monitoring and reporting) at an hourly rate of £12.68 per hour (£14.21 per hour including Holiday Pay)

Apples (part 2)

Last August the "Apple Team" were raring to go. We had booked the Merry Bells for a pressing day, set up a WhatsApp group for pickers and even had plans to buy our own apple mill. We got out the spreadsheet of contacts and started to call the tree owners who we have worked with in previous years. But it was not good news. Many people told us that they had very little fruit on their trees, and what there was, was often very small. For this, and a variety of other reasons, only one of our ten usual contacts had fruit for us to pick this year. There were a few trees in the village that had a good year and we were pleased to be contacted by a couple more residents who asked us to pick for them.

In all we picked 130kg of fruit, the best of which was placed outside the shops or taken to the food larder for people to share. Some of the small and damaged fruit went to village chutney makers. For comparison, last year we picked over 600kg of fruit and in one particularly "fruitful" year we picked over a tonne.

Since we did not have enough apples left for juicing, we had to cancel the pressing day. This was disappointing as it is always a lovely social occasion which has begun to feel like part of the village's social calendar.

Thank you to the shop owners who host our baskets of fruit, the tree owners who share their crops, the pickers who offer their time and everyone else who contributes. We hope for a more successful year in 2024.

Don't forget the next Swapshop is on Saturday 20th January. As usual please bring any usable items between 9.00am and 10.15am (after which we won't accept anything) and take away anything you want from 10.30am -12.00.

Our local garden club

Hopefully you don't have too many jobs to do in the garden right now when daylight is a scarce resource and temperatures are decidedly chilly. It is a great opportunity to review the last year and plan for the next. Curl up with a good book – or seed catalogues!

December

Now is the time to take hardwood cuttings which are easy but usually need more patience to yield results. I have a silver birch, grown from a tiny whip, and I shall pollard it this month to keep it small and if you need to prune acers or vines, now is the time to avoid them 'bleeding' catastrophically. Standard apples and pears also need pruning now to retain an open, healthy structure. New trees and shrubs can also be planted now while dormant. I have just given up my allotment but I'm sure many of you have lots of lovely, winter veg to harvest!

January

As we turn the corner into another year, green shoots of bulbs are already visible and lift the heart in these still dark but gradually lightening days. Crisp sunny days lure us outside — and why not? Birds are already bobbing about busily — do put out food and water. Check all your structures for damage and make



good. I have a young peach tree in a pot and I will need to shelter it from excess wet and the risk of peach leaf curl. I will also be checking dahlia tubers that I have in store. I no longer have rhubarb but if you do, you can bring a crown or two on early by covering it from the light – something to look forward to!





ASDA Wheatley Community Update

What a whirlwind October was! With one of our biggest fundraising months to date, our Tickled Pink fundraising was a huge success, with a number of colleagues getting involved in our cycle event in the foyer over the weekend of the 7th and 8th each pedalling for at least an hour, so a huge challenge for us all. There was so much positivity from everyone to keep going, and we all really appreciated the moral support.

We also had 3 volunteers come in to support our fundraising efforts, and again many thanks to everyone for getting involved. We raised £527.95 over this first weekend.

On Sunday 15th October, Thame Concert Training Band, played in store which sounded amazing, to help us raise a further £187.55. An update of our 2023 fundraising for our National Charities will be provided in the next newsletter which will include all of our Children in Need activity.

We are incredibly proud of what we have raised this year, but of course as always, it's a huge team effort from customers and colleagues and supporters alike to make this happen.

At the time of writing, we have had two successful grants for Grant Round 3 which closed on Friday 3rd November. Firstly for Oxford City Farm who applied for funding for kitchen cleaning equipment to help run cookery sessions. They were awarded £500, which was presented to them at their autumn fair during October.

Our other success grant application was for the Howe Trust, who applied for an Empowering Communities Grant to help create a pond in a wild community nature garden in the half an acre paddock known as Dalton's Field. This new garden will be a special green place for everyone in the village to visit and enjoy for many years to come. A grant of £535 was awarded and presented at the Tree plant during November.

With regards to other fundraising over the last two months, a total of £2, 417.49 was raised outside of Tickled Pink with 5 other groups running awareness or fundraising activity in our foyer.

We supported a number of events over half term with donations of pumpkins for carving, and Christmas fundraising requests have been coming in for the last few weeks to support activities such as raffles and Christmas fairs over the next couple of months. We will try to support as many of those causes as we can.

We are also looking at partnering with a couple of local schools with our Christmas Card activity, to send cards to local care homes. If your schools or community group would like to be involved with this, please get in touch. A post box will be located in the foyer, and I will leave a few blank cards for children to colour by the community board, so please only post these back in this post box. I will get these delivered the week prior to Christmas. If you could leave the inside blank and I will add a message.

In the pipeline, early next year, we are looking at setting up a community hub, possibly on a quarterly basis for networking and groups to share best practice. I have made contact with a number of my current connections, but if you would like to join let me know. The first one of these is likely to be held at the end of January or early February, so may not be in time to share in the next newsletter.

We would like to take this opportunity to wish you all the very best for the festive period.

In the third part of the series on Wheatley in the 1930s, we look at its employment in the 1930s.

There is a record which shows, in 1936, Wheatley had 117 employees at Morris/Pressed Steel. The 1939 census, probably typical of the 1930s, suggests other local employment to have been 60 in building trades, 50 in shops and hospitality, 40 in the brickworks, 15 at the sawmill, 20 in farming, 30 as servants, 20 with driving jobs, 25 as gardeners or market gardeners, 10 on the railway, 10 teaching in the two schools, 5 as smiths and 120 or so in various other roles, a total of over 500. There was full employment in Wheatley and living standards had risen significantly, based on the move from agriculture to industry.

In an essay J G Key, headmaster of the C of E School from 1925 to 1954, was concerned about the effect that new local industries paying much higher wage rates would have on Wheatley's social fabric. But he noted that, in addition to new Council houses in the late 1920s.



more than fifty private houses had been built. These were occupied by people 'possessing some talent for leadership', resulting in many local clubs and societies being formed.

Key asked whether the social life of the village should be under the direction of the Parish Council. In the early 1900s, the Council had organised and financed village celebrations. He noted that it now took almost no role in such arrangements, put together and financed by the multitude of local organisations which then existed.

He went on to praise Wheatley's move from a unitary authority in 1932, passing over many of its local roles to a new District Council, which he felt at the time would lead to greater efficiency and cost saving – a conclusion now much in question!

Each man was to receive 1oz tobacco and each lady ¼ lb tea and some sweets. After tea scenes from "Cranford" were performed by the drama group. The party was a great success with over 70 attendees.

Investing in the Village Hall

As we approach the end of the year, we are pleased to say that we are recovering well from the lean few years of Covid, with the Trustees and Management Committee continuing not only to maintain the facilities to a high standard but at the same time investing in new developments.

With winter here one such development has been the installation of a 'state of the art' thermostat linked to our automated online booking system. This means for every booking in the Main Hall the heating will automatically come on one and a half hours before the start of the booking and turn-off when it finishes. How about that? When booking the Hall you no longer have to worry about it being warm enough for when you start your meeting or celebration. And it means we don't have to heat it when it's not being used.

Routine maintenance and repairs remain necessary in a building that dates from 1888 and as we have written before, since the Merry Bells became a Charitable Trust for the benefit of the Village just over fifty years ago, the Trustees and Management Committee have invested over one million pounds in its development and maintenance.

Some of the recent maintenance has or will include re-pointing the building's brickwork and repairing the steps from the Car Park to the High Street.

We are proud to be part of and contribute to a vibrant Community, such as making the facilities available for the very successful Christmas Market.

Finally, we would like to say 'thank you' to Dave and Carol Parker of the Farm Shop on London Road for supplying the plants free-of-charge for our displays on the Merry Bells forecourt. **Thank you.**

Speaking of the forecourt, we need to ask for your help, as follows. While we are very pleased to see many people using the chairs and tables on the forecourt, we need to ask that they are kept clear of the defibrillator, so there is easy and immediate access. As mentioned in previous reports, this summer Wheatley Playing Field Trust has installed more floodlights on the tennis courts/tarmac area. Anyone who would like to take part in some exercise that is not overly strenuous will welcome. 

This is all that now remains of Cullum House in Ambrose Rise. Social landlord Soha Housing is redeveloping the block on the same footprint to become its first entirely net zero carbon emissions scheme. Development Manager Marc Gregory says "We're thrilled to be



working with RJ Leighfield, along with various zero carbon specialists, on this project to achieve our ambitious target of delivering a scheme achieving net zero carbon. After all the pre-construction due diligence, Soha started work in earnest in October. When completed, Cullum House will have twelve self-contained apartments: eight one-bed and four two-bed homes. Externally, the development will be soft landscaped with turf, low level shrubbery and parking, including electric car charging points for each apartment. Handover is anticipated around the end of summer 2024 but we'll be sure to offer regular news updates to the Wheatley Newsletter." Don't Let Their Light Go Out

The Advent card delivered to all homes in the Wheatley area announces, "The true light has come into the world." It is a challenging statement in a world racked by war and anger — especially in the Holy Land, where the light originated and is in danger of being extinguished.

Members of the parish Justice and Peace Group attended the recent candlelit Peace Vigil held in Broad Street by Oxford's civic and faith leaders, including Christians, Jews, Muslims, Hindus, Sikhs, and Buddhists; it was an act of solidarity with those who suffer on all sides.

For some years at Our Lady of Lourdes we have supported The Friends of the Holy Land (FHL), an ecumenical Christian Charity whose patrons include the Archbishop Justin Welby, and Cardinal Vincent Nichols. The Friends of the Holy Land work for peace and reconciliation in Israel, the West Bank, Jordan, and Gaza and offer particular support to the minority Christian population.

For example, at the time of writing, FHL is supporting Sr Nabila Saleh, a religious sister serving in the small church of the Holy Family, Gaza, where she is housing over 700 people seeking refuge. She said, "There is only destruction and desolation around. We have been shut in here now for weeks in a seesaw of information from the outside that increases our anxiety." An aggressive flu virus is spreading among the refugees, and they are only able to access medicine through brave FHL workers, still operating in Gaza City.

There is a real fear that the devastation of Gaza and unrest on the West Bank will drive the last members of the ancient Christian community to leave forever the land where Jesus walked, the homeland of the Christian faith. FHL seeks prayers and donations to enable it to respond to families' urgent and increasingly desperate needs in Gaza, the West Bank, East Jerusalem, and Israel. Donations may be sent via www.friendsoftheholyland.org.uk/donate. It is an especially worthy cause to shield that light this Advent.

The whole refurbishment operation will run until early July 2024, by which time there will be a stone and tiled floor, much improved heating, lighting, and new toilets. Meanwhile, church services are taking place in Our Lady of Lourdes in Crown Road, courtesy of the Catholic Church.

shortly. Meanwhile, the Wheatley Bell Ringers continue to practice on Friday evenings and to ring on Sundays.

And the cost of it all? £650,000. Thanks to the generosity of so many people in Wheatley and beyond – as well as to several grant bodies - a large sum has been raised. Finance was recently boosted by a major grant from the SODC and generous second grant from Oxfordshire Historic the Churches Trust. But we are still a good £25,000 short of breaking even. Fund raising continues, but we are very nearly there.

Our grateful thanks to so many people, who have supported the work thus far. It's been a long and tortuous journey, but by next summer, the end should be in sight.

Care for the World

Many readers will be sorry to hear of the passing, on All Saints' Day, of the Reverend Charles Brock, who died peacefully at his home in Pennsylvania, and was the minister of Wheatley URC, for 36 years from 1963, during which the church flourished and many friends were made in the local community.

Continuing the focus on our ministry teams, our Care for the World team, which has a focus on our responsibility to care for the wider community, meets regularly and is responsible for supporting, through dissemination of information and fundraising, a number of charitable organisations. These have previously included Asylum Welcome, Oasis of Peace (a school and community in Israel, dedicated to peace and equality, run jointly by Israelis and Palestinians) and, over the past three years, a key priority has been supporting Zimbabwe, and particularly the Falcon Junior School on the outskirts of Harare, where education is provided for children unable to afford the costs of state education in that desperately poor country. youtu.be/Kr-rvk-XXMs gives a good impression of the school.

We also support Christian Aid, with its ever-deepening concern for climate change, Amnesty International, and an Oxford foodbank. We are guided in our work by the national URC's Commitment for Life team, and also lend a hand with the church's Fairtrade commitment, One World Week, and the annual World Day of Prayer, which this year came from Taiwan and next year will be from Palestine. The Care for the World team organises an annual service focusing on these issues, usually in Fairtrade Fortnight with an accompanying stall of goods from Headington Fairtrade. We are already looking forward to our Christmas services, both the traditional candlelight carol service at 6pm on Sunday December 24th and the usually lively Christmas morning service at 10.00 on the 25th, to both of which, of course, all are welcome.


We have a large variety of speakers touching on many subjects and charities.
