Chair's Column

Happy New Year!

As I write my Chairman's Report, I am looking out at my waterlogged garden and the thought briefly enters my head that perhaps I should consider building an Ark. If all these days of rain isn't a sign of some kind of change to the climate, I don't know what is.

I'm sure I am not alone in thinking about what needs to be done in 2024. Your Parish Council also have things to do with an active agenda to deliver for our village. I have summarised a few (not all) here.

- Littleworth Field we are edging closer to taking on a lease for the field adjacent to the school. Our aim over the new couple of years is to bring the field back into use as a community park for all villagers to enjoy.
- 2) The empty Cadet Hut on Littleworth Road we are working on taking on the lease for this site. It is owned by OCC and leased by the MoD. They wish to give up the building and we would be happy to take it on for our Youth Club. Sadly, there are some outstanding issues that need to be dealt with first.
- 3) Holton Park (Oxford Brookes Site) We continue to work with Holton Parish Council and the developers to ensure that what's built there is the best it can be. Brookes are due to leave in

- late summer 2024 so we'll see if events are kept on schedule.
- 4) Miss Tombs Field The field has now been purchased by a local developer and we are keen to build a good relationship with them as we have with Crest Nicholson.

There are more things we are working on, and the list never seems to get any shorter, but we will update what we can when we can through the usual channels.

Just before Christmas WPC with the Emma Wilson Trust held an awards ceremony to celebrate volunteers in the village. There were several categories, and all were worthy winners for what they do/have done for our village. If you haven't, please consider voting next year, it means so much for the recipients. WPC is incredibly grateful for the work that they do.

Finally, WPC is committed to delivering good things for our village, but we need help to do it. We currently have 11 serving councillors, but we should have 15. If you would like to get involved and understand the role and commitment required, please feel free to contact me. I am happy to have an initial chat about what we do and what sits with us at parish level.

Council budget and precept 2024-2025

At our meeting in December the council considered its budget and precept request for 2024-25.

The precept is a small percentage of your Council Tax that residents of Wheatley pay towards the parish council to help it maintain its facilities and services. Mindful of its projects to deliver new facilities in the village and current financial pressures being faced by residents and the parish council, councillors held a healthy debate before finally agreeing on raising the precept by 7.5%. This equates to an increase of £5.49 per Band D property.

We have provided a breakdown on our income and expenditure on page 6.

Making a Difference – become a parish councillor

If your new years' resolution is to become more involved in village life, becoming a parish councillor could not be more rewarding. You can make a positive impact within your community whilst developing your own skills and ensuring that your parish council delivers all its statutory functions. WHEATLEY PARISH COUNCIL-BUDGET & PRECEPT 2024-




Background

For the financial year 2024-25 Wheatley Parish Council has set the precept for a Band D property at £89.21 (an increase of £5.49). The increase of 7.5% will generate a total precept of £160,963 that the council will use to manage and maintain its facilities and to expand the services it offers to the community.


Unlike our District and County Council's Wheatley Parish Council do not receive any funding from central government or business rates, we are only able to carry out the work we do through the precept, paid by households in Wheatley.

Wheatley Neighbourhood Plan



On 23 November 2023 the Wheatley Neighbourhood Plan Review was put to public Referendum Vote by the Examiner, after 8.5 years work by the Committee.

The Neighbourhood Planning Process has certainly been long, but it was carried out by a well-informed and widely representative Committee.

When we started, we worked within the framework of the anticipated Local Plan. Political changes in the county, however, prevented the Plan's adoption, so we were advised to remove the Enhancement elements of our Plan (involving the release of Greenbelt land) in order to gain approval for other parts of the Plan.

Once the Local Plan LP 2035 was finally adopted, we by way of a Neighbourhood Plan Review, reintroduced the Enhancements and submitted our Review for Examination. When the Examiner was satisfied and WPC had given its approval, we submitted the Neighbourhood Plan Review to a Referendum.

The Plan received 514 votes for and 72 votes against.

From now on, The Parish and District Councils can comment on and control Planning Applications on the basis of our Neighbourhood Plan which was created on behalf of this community.

Thanks from WNP Committee to local community members for their often publicly open encouragement to 'keep going', and to the 20+ WNP Committee members for that mix of tolerance, humour, gritty wisdom, and appreciation which brings home how valuable community meetings really are. My personal thanks to Roy Gordon, Vice-Chairman, for his support and company over these years.



Our Diamond Jubilee Year

2024 marks our Diamond Anniversary. The Church of Our Lady Lourdes arose through years of hope and prayer, achieved by the vision, hard-work, and determination of the Catholic Community in Wheatley. Today, that same commitment is evident in our Anglican friends of St Mary the Virgin, who are sharing our Church whilst their own is being refurbished, as they create their own exciting vision of a Church and community hub.

From 1922, Catholics met to celebrate Mass in a several different locations – first in the Old House in Kiln Lane, then in the grounds of the army hospital in Holton, followed by a small hall in Farm Close and a room in the Merry Bells. But in 1962 a Tithe Barn with adjoining cottage in Crown Road, originally belonging to Rectory Farm, was bought by the Parish for £6000 – how times change!

Two great barn doors, which had been used for winnowing and for loading wagons, became the entrance porch and the Lady Chapel, and Lancet windows were installed to complement the architecture of Rectory House. The restoration and building work was undertaken almost entirely by parishioners, including cleaning and stripping the great beams which form the roof; the team included John Garry, Des Coveley and John McCarthy.

The work was completed in 1964 when the first Mass was celebrated by the then Parish Priest, Fr Denis Egan. Then, as now, ecumenical relationships in the Village were strong and the first readings at Mass were by representatives of the Anglican and URC churches.

The Church of Our Lady of Lourdes now has a strong, regular worshipping community of over 40 parishioners — and it is not unusual, at our 6pm Saturday Mass, for us to welcome people from other parts of the country, and from overseas, visiting friends and relatives in the area.

We owe a great deal to the vision of those Wheatley parishioners of the 1960s.

From the Vicar

Christmas seems but a few days ago and already we are launching into Lent with Ash Wednesday this year falling 14th February, Valentine's Day. It seems very fitting to me that Lent begins on this day. On Valentine's Day many cards are sent, often anonymously, sealed with a kiss, an 'x'. The 'x' is a sign of the love that the sender has for the recipient. Hopefully the anonymous card is the start and the sender will find the courage to declare their love more openly. As the saying goes: "Faint heart never won fair ladv."

On Ash Wednesday, in many churches, worshipers are marked on their foreheads with a cross, '+', in ash. The mark of the cross proclaims Christ's love for us. As a parent might kiss their child on the forehead when tucking them up in bed, so the mark of Christ's love is made on our foreheads. We are precious and beloved children of God.

The cross also indicates Christ's dying on the cross — the ultimate act of love for you and for me. On the cross, Jesus took all the hurt of sin

that should be ours and transformed it to the stuff of joy at his resurrection on Easter Day. When we receive the mark of the cross on Ash Wednesday, we acknowledge his great love for us and declare it to the world.

But, just as a love affair which starts with an 'x' on a card must develop further if it is to endure, so must our relationship with Christ Lovers delight in learning more about one another and delight pleasing one another with gifts and compliments. Lovers find themselves to only be truly complete when they are together. In the same way, those who want to accept the love of Christ, declared by the cross, must strive to know him better. Three of the best ways of getting to know Christ better are to spend time with him in prayer, to read about him in the Bible and to come to church and join others who are seeking to learn more about him.

May you have a blessed Lent and Easter.

World Day of Prayer

One of the activities with which Wheatley URC has long been involved is the annual World Day of Prayer, a global, ecumenical event in which the women of a different nation each year lead a service where they tell us of their lives and experiences and encourage us to support them in prayer. The origin of each year's service is decided well in advance, with a seven-year programme ahead as far as Jamaica 2031, so it seems particularly poignant that last year's service was from potential geopolitical hotspot Taiwan and this year's will be presented by the women of Palestine.

There are a remarkable 50,000 Christians living in the West Bank while about 3,000 live in Gaza. The focus of each year's service is determined by women from Catholic, Protestant and Orthodox traditions. The Palestinian women who compose the service for 2024 have worked for several years on the programme and have chosen the theme "I Beg You... Bear With One Another in Love," from the Letter to the Ephesians, generally thought to be written by St Paul when he was in prison.

Illustrating the experiences of Palestinian women from three generations it will use the olive tree, an ancient symbol of peace, throughout the service. As well as peace, justice and freedom of both belief and movement, the service will cover our responsibility for climate change. While there is a belief around the world that the women of the Middle East are passive, silent, and non-influential, the team behind this year's service tell us that historically and today they are steadfast, strong, and courageous.

The World Day of Prayer has proved moving and informative over the last few years. People of any gender and any faith or none are warmly invited to the URC for the service at 2pm on Friday March 1st, with refreshments served afterwards. Please give this remarkable event a try.

At the Wheatley Christmas Fair our Ukraine guests provided an exciting range of traditional soups, nibbles, and cakes as well as a range of art and craft materials. Many people stopped to talk and were delighted our Ukraine guests participate in these events.

As the atrocities continue in Ukraine, and elsewhere, we were reminded of the goodwill and friendliness of our Wheatley residents supporting refugees trying to cope with disruption in their lives.



In early December, our Ukraine guests and community supporters enjoyed a traditional Cream Tea at the Merry Bells. The organisers provided Christmas balloons, crackers, and cakes.

During January and February, we are organising a regular informal conversation / discussion group. This will cover a number of topics and provide an opportunity for Ukrainians to hear about and discuss aspects of British culture as well as how to cope with day-to-day practical issues such as renting accommodation or arranging additional classes for children.

We have decided to delay the next Global Aid Network (GaiN) collection until late September. Many thanks for the very generous donations received during 2023.

YOUR Wheatley Village Archive

In 2024 WVA is publishing, through the village newsletter, a series about trades in Wheatley over the centuries. More information can be found on our website, do check out www.wheatleyarchive.org.uk We start the year with the many butchers in the village.

The Rose family acquired the property at the west end of Church Road and High Street in 1751. There was a slaughterhouse on the site from 1809 to 1938, and cattle were pastured on the, now, greatly diminished village green awaiting slaughter. Ernest Alden took over the business in 1911 and it closed in 1938.

Ernest (1863-1950), the great-grandson of Isaac Alden (1764-1832), also owned a butcher's shop on Bear Lane, Oxford, in 1793. In the 19th century the business was expanded and moved to Eastwyke Farm near the city centre. By the start of the 20th century, Isaac's grandson, another Isaac, with two of Isaac's cousins and his two sons, Ernest and Cyril, were all five trading as butchers, in Oxford's Covered Market. This family also owned Alden's Farm, now known as Wheatley Bridge Farm opposite the farm buildings which are now converted to offices etc. In 1910, another member of the family, Frederick Alden, was a tenant in Parkhill in a house owned by Mrs Smith, built in the grounds of The Mount in Parkhill. Today Alden's business is based in Osney Mead, Oxford, a family business of over 230 years, still supplying colleges, restaurants, and also the Palace of Westminster, with a history partly developed in Wheatley.

In the same year (1911) that Alden's acquired the Rose butchery business, the Premier Meat Company opened a shop at 50 High Street, Wheatley. This, however, closed during or soon after the Great War. West Brothers took over the premises in the 1920s/1930s with Samuels trading there from 1936 until 2000. Ted West moved his business to 2 Station Road in 1936 until the late 1950s, then John West took it over until 1960/61.

There were other butchers at Chillingworth House, 64 High Street run by Mr Bathard until the early 1920s, and Charles Shorter's business at Sunnyside in London Road in the 1930s.

White's butchers traded at 82, High Street in the 1930s. Maurice Crick worked for White and married White's daughter, Valerie, in 1958. In 1973 they set up their own butcher's shop, Crick's, in Wheatley, shown here in 1977.

After Maurice died in 2011, the business was taken over by Mark Surman and Colin Ware, and since March 2014, by Jason Robinson and his wife selling excellent meat.



Wheatley was certainly well served in the past by various meat outlets! In the meantime, vegetarianism has affected the meat trade, but Wheatley is still lucky to retain one butcher shop.

Wheatley Village Produce Association

Our local garden club

In a change from our usual format, I enclose a message from our President:

"Village Produce Associations (VPA) were introduced throughout the country in 1939 by the government to reduce reliance on imported food as part of the "Dig for Victory" campaign. Wheatley's VPA was formed in 1940 shortly after headmaster Ernest Knowles was evacuated from London to the village. Many parts of Wheatley were used to grow food, including what is now the Merry Bells car park.

VPAs were very successful, continuing after the war, although most have now ceased to exist. Wheatley VPA, however, continued to provide support inspiration to generations and gardeners and expanded to hold events for eleven months of the year including monthly lectures, not all related to gardening, an annual horticultural show, visits to gardens of note, an annual dinner and a 5-day holiday visiting gardens and places of interest. We now concentrate on recreational general gardening and enjoyment. That Wheatley VPA has survived where others have failed and still attracts a good response to all events at a very modest cost, indicates that the membership fully support the Association. Despite this support, we have not been able to attract sufficient officers to continue after 2024. We are looking for a small number of people in the community to assist the committee to carry the Association forward into 2025



beyond. The roles are not arduous with only around six committee meetings spread throughout the year, each usually lasting only an hour. Experience in horticulture is not necessary. If you think you could help and wish to find out more, please contact the VPA via email: wheatleyvpa@gmail.com."



ASDA Wheatley Community Update

The last three months of the year are one of the busiest in our community calendar helping to support the Poppy Appeal, Children in Need, Tickled Pink Breast Cancer charities plus our Christmas outreach activities including various local community groups.

For Children in Need, we have again partnered with a number of local schools in Oxfordshire including Wheatley Primary School to help raise money to support projects and charities across the UK. In total our six visits with Pudsey raised £1284.14, which included non-uniform days, cake sales, guess the name of the teddy and colouring money boxes.

As part of these school visits, we held a 'Design a T Shirt' competition, with all entries being collected by our Store and one winner from each school was chosen to receive a small prize from our Store Manager Michael. We would like to thank all children who entered.

We have worked with a couple of local schools, to help us with our Christmas card activity, sending cards to The Triangle Care Home, as well as us providing a small chocolate hamper and we are sure they were delighted to receive this and especially for the children to have thought of them.

Overall, with regards to fundraising, we have supported groups with space donations to enable them to raise almost £16,500 amongst 31 groups. We also had a further seven awareness sessions for causes to promote their not-for-profit groups.

Our Tickled Pink fundraising this year, raised the most monies since I have been in this role, running a number of activities throughout the year, for both colleagues and customers. In total, £3,575 was raised over the year and we are looking to run another two bingo nights this year, one for Tickled Pink, and another for Children in Need.

Last year, there were 17 successful Grant applications with funding from the ASDA Foundation, which totalled over £9,250. In addition, we donated £1,555 which included any community activity such as visits to schools to help promote healthy eating, oral health sessions, or waste and recycling as a few examples.

In terms of outreach for the year, we have supported almost 200 activities, with over 450 hours spent in the community, which includes anything from litter picks to help transform spaces; to helping out at open days; fundraisers and local food banks/larders. There hasn't been a week during the year, when I have spent the whole week in our Store!

You may have seen me at the Wheatley Fair at the end of November and delighted that a couple of families said they really look forward to my crafting activities, with fond memories of previous years.

One of our first activities during 2024, is to work with the Salvation Army to encourage customers to donate their old clothes to help fund breast cancer treatments. We will be running The Big Clothing Clear Out from 12th January - 2nd February. There will be a trolley instore, with donation bins at the back of our car park or via the George Take Back Scheme. Plus, our support for the Community Emergency Food Bank and the Hyigene bank is ongoing during this time.

We are planning for another bumper year to continue to build on existing and new community networks, and relationships to make a difference locally.

Wheatley Playing Field Trust

The Trust has a number of planned works and events taking place this year. Major tree works will be undertaken during the February half term. Please be aware of this and keep away from any work being undertaken.

At Easter, much needed pitch improvement is being carried out. This includes verti-draining to decompact the grass surfaces followed by fertilising.

Last year, extra floodlights were put up on the tarmac area. This has, for the first time, allowed women's league netball matches to take place.

Recently, additional grants have been obtained to purchase mobile floodlights. This will allow training to take place at night on other areas of the playing field. The floodlit pitch is heavily used at present and is deteriorating rapidly.

This summer two major events are taking place on the playing field. The first, on June 22nd, is a fundraising event organised by the Oxford Downs Syndrome Group. ODG held their first, highly successful event in June 2018 and

the Trust is hoping this event will be equally well supported.

The second one, on July 13th, is that most popular annual family event, the Wheatley Play Day.

As mentioned in above, the very wet weather this winter has left the pitches in not the best of conditions. There should be no unauthorised use and the pitches can only be used through booking by a registered user. Also, if all pitches have been fully booked then this means that there is no availability for use. Misuse of the booking system spoils it for the bona fide clubs.
