Chair's Column

Happy New Year to you all.

I have two positive pieces of news to share in this column.

Firstly, last August the window was opened for applications to South Oxfordshire District Councils Capital Grant Fund to support projects within the community. WPC applied for a sum of money to refurbish Church Road Recreation Ground. The last 'refurb' was in 2007, and play equipment only lasts 20 years, so an upgrade was due. In November I sat in front of a Grants Panel and answered questions and explained our project. On Christmas Eve I received an email with an offer letter – giving us our full request of £50K. With the money we have set aside in our reserves, we can bring this project to fruition during 2026.

Secondly, just before Christmas I was lucky enough to see footage of the High Street culvert. You may remember that OCC put a camera down the culvert to check its condition. The culvert is an extraordinary piece of Victorian engineering in good condition, and the water is flowing freely. There are a lot of pipes coming together in Crown Square, but our culvert is standing up to the task. This fits in with meetings Cllr Ramsdale and I had with the district drainage engineers and the preliminary plans for Attenuation Ponds on Littleworth field and flood engineering work on Shotover Estate to hold water back from coming down the High Street.

Wheatley Parish Council have not yet signed the lease for Littleworth Field, but we are very close and as soon as we do, we will use the finalised plans of the ponds, plus the spoil from the earthworks to design a community park that will be a joy to visit. Part of our long-term strategy is to provide a more physically challenging activity area for older children, areas of biodiversity (to utilise the boggy area), walks, open play, and picnic areas. We also hope to use the slope of the land to create an amphitheatre for open air performances.

We admit these are ambitious long-term plans, which will take time to deliver, but if you aim for the moon, you might hit the tops of the trees, which will be a start. It is also important to see that Littleworth Field and Church Road Recreation Ground are interrelated, and together they will form lovely open areas for our community.

Finally, the MOD has formally given notice on the old Cadet Hut (at last), and some councillors and I are meeting the County Surveyor in January to agree Heads of Terms for a lease on the building. Our parish office duties are expanding, and we need more room to deliver services for our village. I will keep you updated as we progress.

The Parish Council felt strongly that, during these challenging times, it is important to continue supporting our village while remaining mindful of household costs.

Making a Difference – Becoming a Parish Councillor

If you feel that 2026 is the year you would like to become more involved in village life, becoming a parish councillor can be a very rewarding experience. It offers the opportunity to make a positive difference in your community, develop new skills, and help ensure the Parish Council continues to meet its statutory responsibilities.

Wheatley Parish Council has helped shape the village over many years, and there are some exciting projects planned for 2026–2027 where new councillors could play an active role.

Progress on Projects

I am delighted to share that, thanks to the hard work of our Parish Chair, Alison Sercombe, Wheatley Parish Council has been awarded a £50,000 grant towards the Church Road Recreation Ground refurbishment. We are wasting no time in beginning the process of updating this much-loved park, which brings so much enjoyment to families and children across the village. We will continue to keep you updated as the project progresses.

Further discussions and meetings are also underway to secure the lease for the Cadet Hut on Littleworth Road.

Call for Voluntary Flood Wardens

During the extreme rain of September 2024, residents of some areas of Wheatley were victims of a fierce flow of water that had a terrible impact on homes, business premises, and villagers. As part of the Action Plan following a Section 19 Report, various initiatives have been suggested, and one of them is having Flood Wardens strategically placed around the trigger points in the village. These are:

- The course of the Wheatley Brook from West Field, down Westfield Lane, Kiln Lane, and then the culvert under the High Street to Crown Square. And Crown Square itself.
- Littleworth Road from its junction with Old Road down to the New Club.
- The lower section of Farm Close Road behind the High Street shops and below Farm Close Lane to Crown Square.
- Old London Road, particularly at the end close to the Eastern junction with London Road.
- The areas of Kelly's Road and Keydale Road adjacent to the stream that runs through Littleworth.

Traffic Working Group Report

Parking In Wheatley

As always, parking in our village continues to create issues and I'd ask everyone to be thoughtful about where they park, especially along our busiest roads, on corners and in residential cul-de-sacs, where emergency and service vehicles may need to get access. In recent weeks we have had a number of situations that demonstrates the problem.

Templars Close

A resident had a serious medical emergency, and an ambulance had to be called. However, due to cars parked on both sides of the road, the ambulance couldn't reach the resident's house. On another occasion the recycling lorry couldn't get into the close and it took three visits before the bins were emptied.

Fairfax Gate

Cars are parking at the entrance to Fairfax Gate and obscuring the view of vehicles trying to pull out onto London Road, making it dangerous to get out onto this busy road.



Remember, you should park at least 10 metres (32 feet) from a junction or corner, as per the UK Highway Code (Rule 243), to avoid obstructing traffic and pedestrians.

Littleworth, Corner Opposite the Row of Cottages

A white line has been painted on the corner to discourage vehicles from parking there. However, this is still happening and has, on occasions, caused disruption with large vehicles trying to get past and also delaying the 46 bus.

Blocked Drains

The conduit under the High Street has been inspected and the good news is that it seems to be in good condition. I have compiled a list of roads in Wheatley where drains are blocked, which I have provided to Oxfordshire County Council.

The blocked drains that are likely to contribute most to flooding are being addressed as a priority by the same team who are dealing with the culvert. These include those on Holloway, Church Road, and Friday Lane.

Tim Bearder (Oxfordshire County Councillor) and I are liaising with Oxfordshire County Council to agree a programme of maintenance for the rest of the drains.

Merry Bells Parking – Good News!

There are parking restrictions in force in the Merry Bells Car Park that means that residents can only park there for 2 hours, during the day, if they aren't visiting the Merry Bells. The good news is that the committee have decided to extend this to 3 hours, making parking there more convenient. **I don't have a date for the change yet so please check the signs when you park.**

Dear Residents of Wheatley,

As we begin the New Year, I wanted to share a short update on some of the work I have been doing in and for Wheatley, and to thank everyone who has been in touch with me over recent months.

I continue to hold Thames Water to account on matters affecting the village, pressing for clearer communication and lasting solutions for residents.

I have been working closely with Oxfordshire County Council and Cllr Tim Bearder to review the impact of double yellow lines in the village and to ensure residents' views are properly considered.

More recently, I am pleased that drain clearance works have been taking place, which should help reduce flooding risks and improve resilience during periods of heavy rain.

I have also been engaging with SSE regarding recent power cuts affecting the area and raised these concerns in Parliament, speaking about the impact of power outages on communities like Wheatley and the need for better reliability and clearer communication.

My constituency survey is now being delivered locally and should be coming through your doors. I would be extremely grateful if you could take a few minutes to complete it. Your feedback will directly inform my work and priorities over the next year, and I want to hear what matters most to you.

Wheatley Windmill Preservation Society

2026 will be the 50th year since the launch of the idea to save our windmill. In order to mark the occasion, the society is holding a competition for pupils in Wheatley Park School, Wheatley Primary School, and the John Watson School to submit either a photograph or an artwork showing the windmill or an aspect of it.

Here are the competition rules:

1. In order to enter, you must be a pupil at one of the schools.
2. From each school, we will accept entries from older or younger pupils. The dividing age groups will be 4-7 or 8-11 in the primary school and 11-14 or 15-18 in the senior school.
3. You may only enter one artwork or photograph, which must be all your own work.
4. We will offer a first or second prize in each class and category.
5. The closing date for competition entries will be 30th April 2026.
6. Entries should be sent or delivered to Secretary, WWPS, 34, Westfield Road, Wheatley, OX33 1NG, with the name, school, and age of the artist or photographer and their contact details on the back to preserve confidentiality.
7. The first and second entries in each age group will be shown at an exhibition to take place in St Mary's church, from 1st to 14th June 2026.
8. The prizes will be awarded at the open afternoon at the windmill on 14th June 2026.

A note on access: the mill and paddock are privately owned and are normally closed to the public. During April 2026, we will arrange to have a steward on site on Saturdays 4th and 18th April from 10 a.m. until 12.30, so that competitors can come to gain inspiration on site. Competitors below the age of 14 should bring an adult with them. There are already a number of photographs on social media, which aspiring artists can use for practice.

A Fast Start to 2026

In previous years, the first two months of the year are traditionally quiet, and we the Trustees have used this period to recover from Christmas and a hectic end to the year. But not this year, when 2026 has started with such a 'bang'!

We have had to cope with increased bookings to hire both the Main Hall and Coffee Room plus our recently refurbished kitchen has proved worth the investment in supporting many of the activities now taking place.

As we wrote many times last year of the major investments planned in 2025, they have all now been completed on time and under budget, which is due to the hard work and diligence of our Trustees and, for those now 'bowing-out', we say on behalf of everyone in the village 'thank you'. We remain grateful for your help in developing one of the best village halls in Oxfordshire and if not, certainly the best in South Oxfordshire.

We know you've asked not to be named but we do appreciate all of the dedication and commitment you have shown and delivered these past years. It is a legacy to be proud of.

So knowing that some of our Trustees would be stepping down, we have now successfully recruited five new Trustees, some representing different village organisations, which has always been the case and we have now managed to cover all of the responsibilities that make the Merry Bells tick, as we go into the new year. Some of the responsibilities still need a bit of tweaking and updating, such as our

booking system. With this system, we are looking to make it easier to navigate and confirm your bookings and also once you have a confirmed booking we will issue you with a digital pass enabling you to gain entry for your event.

Here, we also want to say a huge 'thank you' to Wheatley Estates for all of their support over the years in helping issue electronic keys and collecting payments for us. We still need their support but again by the next issue of the Newsletter, we hope the new system will be up and running.

Finally, we return to the topic of parking in the Merry Bells car park and are delighted to say that, as far as we know, all of our car park users who were wrongly issued with fines have received their refunds or have had their fines cancelled. If you are someone who has paid a fine incorrectly issued but have not received a refund, please let us know straight away.

We are pleased to say that the system is now working as it should and the time-limit currently remains at two hours.

However, as we write, we are pleased to confirm that our negotiations to increase the limit to three hours are now almost complete, with just the contracts to be signed by both parties.

But in the meantime, please stick to the two-hour limit until you see the new signs showing the three-hour limit are in place.

Wheatley Playing Field Trust

Last year, Wheatley Parish Council commissioned a building survey of both pavilions on the Wheatley Playing Field, Holton. The last time this was carried out was in 2016 and both buildings have shown some deterioration in that time.

The upper pavilion, to which the Clubhouse is attached, was built in 1973 and the lower pavilion was opened in 1982. The extra changing rooms were needed by increasing numbers of users, including Wheatley Park School which had amalgamated the upper and lower schools onto its current campus in Holton.

Planning permission for the top pavilion was granted in 1973 with the proviso that the pavilion must be an agricultural building to reflect the previous use of the fields. As a consequence, both buildings were constructed with a timber frame with a lifespan of 25 years. All the main services in both buildings date from the time of construction and issues are now occurring due to the length of time they have been operating. The lower pavilion gas boiler has broken down twice this winter. Hot water is obtained from a 150-gallon tank in the loft. All this water has to be heated to supply a few washbasins. If heating is needed (this system was updated a couple of years ago) then, because they are not separate systems, the water in the tank is heated as well. Both tanks have leaks and the framework which carries them has had to be braced because of water damage.

Following the building survey, Wheatley Playing Field Trust has commissioned a structural engineer to report on any remedial work needed to extend the life of the pavilions. This could include revision to the heating and plumbing systems, repair of one of the wooden frame stanchions and replacement of the roof, currently concrete asbestos sheets, to modern insulated sheeting. The Trust is working closely with the Wheatley Parish Council with regard to this work and further investigations will take place over the Easter holiday.

Sustainable Wheatley held their 75th Swap Shop on Saturday 24th January 2026, and they have now been running for 20 years.

In early 2006 a small group of Wheatley residents came together in an informal Community Action Group and decided to hold a recycling event in the Merry Bells in Wheatley.

It was billed as a “Bring and Take” event and the basic idea was that instead of sending unwanted items to landfill, we encouraged Wheatley residents to bring them along so that others could find a use for them. A few people came to the event and were generally bemused – they could not believe that you could just take stuff for free – but the reception was mostly positive and so the group decided to pursue the idea.

Following this initial event, contact was made with Oxfordshire CAG group, the Wheatley group was formally set up and we were then able to receive grants to support us.

Subsequent events were billed as “Swap Shops”, with another two held in 2006 and then five in 2007. By now the idea was catching on and we were recording attendance and the weight of usable items taken away. People in the village overcame their initial scepticism and attendance grew to around 200. In September 2007 we attracted 393 customers; we were not prepared for this, and the Merry Bells became overcrowded. Following this we introduced an entry system to limit the number in the hall at any one time.

Over time the swap shops settled into a pattern, with four per year held in the Merry Bells, and with tea and coffee on sale for the customers. They have become a regular part of village life and are eagerly anticipated. They also attract people from the surrounding area with some attendees prepared to queue for over an hour before entry. The 50th Swap Shop was celebrated in October 2017. Typical attendance now is about 150 with many others dropping items off beforehand; about 650 kg of items are taken by individuals at each event. The items left over at the end are donated to charities, readvertised on a village Freebies group or taken for recycling. Donations from attendees are usually generous enough to cover the costs of the events and a loyal group of volunteers keeps things running smoothly.

Covid caused a temporary halt to the events, and when we resumed in April 2022, a few changes were made to limit close contact between people – we introduced a ‘one-way’ system in the hall, with tighter control on numbers in the room, and we stopped doing refreshments. We also separated the ‘receiving’ and ‘taking’ processes, so that items were not brought in when the hall was full of people.

The main running costs are the hire of the hall at the Merry Bells, and the hire of a van to dispose of the leftovers. Funding was initially from the Oxfordshire CAG group with a

grant of £250 per year, with the balance being donated by the public. The Swap Shops are now largely self funded, but we receive a grant from Oxfordshire CAG to cover most of our insurance costs of the swap shops and the group's other activities.

In the 20 years we have been running these Swap Shops over 46 tonnes of items have been re-used within our community. Thank you to all of our customers, all of our helpers, and to CAG Oxfordshire for their help over the years.

URC News

The URC, both nationally and in Wheatley, has long been active in supporting the needs of our brothers and sisters throughout the world, needs which seem more pressing by the day, as governments worldwide slash their foreign aid budgets and military might seems regularly to trump (no pun intended) ethical values.

Our Care for the World team ran a very successful fundraising evening at the end of October, featuring celebrated harpist Becki Luff, which raised a total of £ 1432 in donations, split equally between Oasis of Peace, an organisation providing practical examples of the way Jewish and Palestinian people can live together in harmony in the Holy Land, and the Falcon School, where our little church has helped sustain and develop a school in a deprived area of a very deprived country, Zimbabwe.

On the first Thursday of each month people meet from 10.00 to 10.30 am in the Mulberry Room for Prayers for the World, a brief time of asking divine assistance to the practical needs of many areas of our suffering planet. We happily welcome those from other denominations or none, who also wish to join us. There is no need to say anything, but the focus of people's prepared prayers often goes way beyond the coincidental.

One of the first dates in my diary is the World Day of Prayer, where Christian women from a country near or far provide an ecumenical service on a pre-determined theme. This year's service is provided by the women of Nigeria and is on the theme 'I will give you rest.' Nigeria has the seventh largest population in the world, the largest GDP in Africa, and over 250 languages. Independent since 1960, with continuing democratic rule since 1999, it has tried with varying degrees of success to bring harmony to the different ethnic groupings forced together by colonial boundaries of the past. In 2024, the Nigerian government re-instituted the country's original national anthem including the lines 'Though tribe and tongue may differ, In brotherhood we stand, Nigerians all and proud to serve Our sovereign Motherland.'

Whatever your denomination or indeed if you merely wish to learn something of how ordinary Nigerians live, think and worship today, you are warmly invited to the World Day of Prayer service at the URC in Crown Square on Friday March 6th at 2pm, followed by refreshments in the church hall. Please note the date in your diaries.

The Liturgical Cycle 2026

In the Christian Church, the liturgical year starts at Advent each year and, over a three-year cycle, our readings focus in turn upon the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, with the Gospel of John used on special occasions throughout each year. As we leave behind Christmastide and the Epiphany, we return to the Ordinary time of the year; until Advent 2026 we will be primarily focussing at Mass on the Gospel of Matthew. But who was he?

Before following Jesus, Matthew worked not as a fisherman but as a tax collector (Matthew 9:9), a profession despised by many Jews at the time. Chosen as one of the twelve apostles sent out to spread the Gospel, he became part of Jesus' inner circle, and his inclusion highlights Jesus' ability to transform lives.

Matthew records 23 parables, all of which teach important lessons about God's Kingdom, including unique stories like the Parable of the Wheat and Tares and the Parable of the Ten Virgins. One of Matthew's most notable contributions is the Sermon on the Mount

(Matthew 5-7), where Jesus taught foundational principles of Christian living, a section which includes the Beatitudes, the Lord's Prayer, and teachings on love, forgiveness, and humility.

Perhaps not surprisingly, the Gospel of Matthew was written primarily for a Jewish audience. For example, the phrase "Kingdom of Heaven" is used over 30 times, more than any other Gospel writer, which reflects Jewish reverence for God's name, avoiding the direct use of "Kingdom of God." The Gospel also emphasizes Jesus as the promised Messiah and contains numerous references to Old Testament prophecies, showing how Jesus fulfilled them.

Matthew ends his Gospel with Jesus' Great Commission, commanding disciples to "make disciples of all nations." It is an invitation to all people, then and now, to follow a missionary voyage of learning and discovery. It is a challenge which we will bear in mind at OLL as we contemplate quietly in the Church, open daily, for private prayer, and at our Vigil Mass each Saturday evening at 6pm.

Dear Friends

This is the dark time of the year when the sun rises late and is gone before five. Christmas jollity is gone; the trees are binned and all the decorations packed away.

December at St Mary's was a time of celebration. Packed houses heard a host of brilliant concerts week by week, from the Angelorum Choir, the Thame Silver Training Band, and the Round the Piano Community Choir. Then the Village Carol Service, with a congregation of 200-plus squeezed into every nook and cranny of the church, and many standing at the back (Memo to the Wardens: book more chairs next year!); a semi-professional choir, great carols, and familiar readings.

Then came the annual Crib Service with children dressed as angels, shepherds, Joseph, Mary, and the Donkey; Midnight Mass and booming bells, early and late Communion, Evensong and Christmas cheer; Epiphany – the Wise Men and the Mystery of the Star. All gone – and now the dark time of the year, and Spring a long way off.

But the 2nd of February is the Festival of Candlemass, when folk took candles into church, where they were blessed and used for the rest of the year. Candlemass recalls the presentation of baby Jesus at the Temple, 40 days after his birth. It symbolises Christ as the 'Light of the World'. Candlemas is a time for looking forward to the light, a new dawn in this dark and troubled world.

The poet TS Eliot describes this time of year:

*Midwinter spring is its own season...
The brief sun flames the ice, on ponds and ditches
In windless cold that is the heart's heat,
Reflecting in the watery mirror
A glare that is blindless in the early afternoon
And glow more intense than blaze of branch, or brazier,
Stirs the dumb spirit: no wind, but Pentecostal fire
In the dark time of the year.*

A Quiet Revival?

In 2015 a bunch of Christians locally came together to start a new church, meeting each Sunday in Wheatley's Merry Bells. What became of them? Why don't they meet there any more? It wasn't that they gave up: their problem was they outgrew the space and had to move to Wheatley Primary School.

It might seem surprising that churches are growing. The familiar narrative is of church decline. Church attendance fell markedly over the past century in UK. But that's not the whole picture. Globally the church is growing fast. Like China, set to be the nation with the largest Christian population by 2030.

But even in the UK something's changed. National surveys show many churches are growing, in all age groups except ages 45-64 (come on guys, you're missing out!). When WCC started only 4% of UK 18-to-24-year-olds attended church at least monthly. By 2025 that's quadrupled to 16%, with particular increases amongst young men.

So, what's going on? Sociologists call this the 'Quiet revival'. Gen Z and Gen Z-A (aged 11-18) are spending more time in isolation, engaging with the world through their screens. Over 60% rank social media as the top place to seek connection. There's a hunger for real connection and for answers to those seeking meaning.

That's what I love about my church. It is a place of real connection. And it's offering some profound answers to questions of meaning. It's a claim made by Jesus' closest friend, the apostle John, who said, 'We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son.' 1 John 1:3. His faith was based on real events he had witnessed for himself, and it brought him real connection with God and with others through his church.

So why not come and check us out? Details below:

Our meetings are relaxed and informal. Visitors are very welcome.

We meet **every Sunday morning at 10.30am** at the **Primary School** for a time of sung worship, prayer, and a talk from the bible.

Children and young people's groups run from part way through the service most weeks.

We will have all-age **Easter Services on 29th March, Palm Sunday and 5th April**, Easter Day

On Thursday 12th February (7.15 for 7.30pm) we will hold a talk in the Merry Bells from Ann Gibson, Chair of Oxford Freedom from Torture group.

Ann will tell us about the origins of the group, where survivors come from and why, how the group supports them (counselling, therapy, legal aid) and campaigning work.

She will talk for 30-40 minutes followed by questions.

We plan our next collection of good condition clothes, bedding and survival gear on behalf of Global Aid Network (GAiN) plus food for Asylum Welcome Food Bank in April, date to be finalised and given in next newsletter.

The food collection at Asda in December was extremely well supported, generosity much appreciated in these difficult times.

In May (date to be finalised) we will have a talk from the Sanctuary Hosting team of Asylum Welcome. This scheme matches hosts with a spare room with (generally) short term accommodation to those granted refugee status, who have only had 28 days to leave hotel accommodation, with no money or connections. The team will explain how they can facilitate such arrangements and provide support to both hosts and guests.

They also seek donations to fund other emergency accommodation.
