ITEM 61 NO SMOKING IN PLAY AREAS PROPOSAL

Strategic Goal: Goal 3 Continue to support wellbeing within our community and encourage and

promote sport and recreation in Wheatley.

Summary: Proposal to promote introduction of no smoking in play areas.

1. Introduction

1.1 Wheatley Parish Council (WPC) has already identified, through its strategic goals, its commitment to improving the lives of those who live in Wheatley.

- 1.2 At its meeting in May 2023, its open spaces committee agreed to introduce no smoking/vaping in the council's three play/recreation areas at Church Rd, Cullum Rd and Farm Close Road.
- 1.3 WPC could implement this by installing standard no-smoking signage, however this proposal goes further and to work in partnership with the local primary school and to engage with younger members of the community.

2. Proposal

- 2.1 This project would seek to approach Wheatley Primary School and offer its pupils the opportunity to design a no-smoking/vaping poster.
- 2.2 From the collection of posters, three designs would be chosen, prizes awarded and printed onto hard waring signage and stickers, that will be placed in and around the play/recreation areas.
- 2.3 The competition would be promoted through our communication channels and jointly with WPS's own newsletters.

3. Resources

- 3.1 We acknowledge that staff at Wheatley Primary School have a challenging workload and WPC officers and councillors would support where they could (instructions, paper etc.)
- 3.2 Prizes (vouchers) would be funded from existing Community Engagement budget. (up t £100)
- 3.3 Costs for signage would be in the region of £400 (15 vinyl stickers and 12 aluminium composite).
- 3.4 Funding of up to £1,000 may be available through <u>Smoke Free Oxfordshire scheme</u>, through a funding application.

4. Risk Management

4.1 If funding was not available, WPC may wish to consider using existing funds to cover the expenditure.

5. Conclusion

- 5.1 The initiative will help WPC improve its engagement with a hard-to-reach area of the community, whilst creating a sense of ownership for play areas, with younger residents.
- 5.2 The initiative supports the council in delivering its own objectives to promote wellbeing.
