Meeting opened with Mr. Rooney in the Chair.

Election of Chairman for the ensuing year.

Proposed by Mrs.C.M.Dalton, seconded by Mr.J.Brooks;
"That Mr.F.A.Rooney be elected Chairman of the Open Spaces Committee".

Proposed by Mr.P.Audley Miller, seconded by Mr.G.McGowan;
"That Mr.P.H.Blake be elected Chairman of the Open Spaces Committee".

Votes in favour of Mr.Rooney - Three.

Votes in favour of Mr.Blake - Three.

Mr. Blake thereupon withdrew and Mr. Rooney was unanimously elected
Chairman.

Mr.P.H.Blake was unanimously elected Vice Chairman.

Resolved. That Mr. R.Turrell be co-opted to the Open Spaces Committee.

Minutes of the Meeting held 1st. June 1977.

Amendment. Mr.Turrell pointed out that his name had been omitted from the se
present.

After the correction the Minutes were approved and signed.

Matters Arising Therefrom.

1. Tree in Car Park. - Mrs.Dalton agreed to order a Plane tree and also obtain details of the cost of a Whitebeam tree for the walled bed to built in High St.
2. Walled Tree Bed and repair of Old Burial Ground wall.
The Clerk had forwarded the account for the repair of the section of Burial Ground wall to the motorist concerned.
He had also written to A.C.Hales accepting his tender for the pointing up of the rest of the wall and to P.B.Construction accepting their tender to build the Walled Tree Bed.
3. The Clerk had ordered the replacement parts for the swings on Cullum Rd. recreation ground.
4. Mrs.Dalton reported that the Guides had made a very creditable effort in their collection of rubbish throughout the village.
Agreed that the Clerk send a letter of appreciation with the cheque for ten pounds.
5. Sites for 'Litter Plate Signs'.
The Clerk had approached Mrs.Paris, of the 'Oxonian Stores' who had agreed to a plate being placed on her property.
It was suggested that the remaining plates be placed as follows;
The wall of Messrs Samuels in High St. Mrs Dalton to obtain consent.
The wall of Church Rd. School. Mr.Rooney to obtain consent.
The wall of Mr.Spencer's property in High St. Mr.Blake to obtain consent.

After consent had been obtained the Clerk would approach Mr.K.Watts regarding the fixing of the signs.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

Par. 3. The Clerk reminded the Committee that nothing had been done regarding the suggestion to erect a stile at the Westfield Road end of Tin Pan Alley. After further consideration it was agreed that the Clerk obtain an estimate, from Mr. Powell of Littleworth, of the cost of erecting a barrier similar to the one erected at the other end of the alley.

The hedge on the roadside in Old Road and the hedge overhanging Tin Pan Alley had both been cut back.

Painting of the recreation grounds equipment was proceeding but was, at the moment held up by the weather. The equipment was being cleaned, primed, undercoated and top coated. The seats in Church Rd. rec. were also being painted. The Clerk was asked if the goal posts and the 'Igloo' were to be painted. He said he would ensure that they were.

It was considered that the seats of the juvenile swings, in Church Rd. rec., were too low and should be brought to the level of the other swings.

There being no further business the Chairman declared the Meeting closed

Minutes of the Meeting held 22nd. June 1977 were approved and signed.

Par.1 MATTERS ARISING THEREFROM.

(a) Tree to be planted in Merry Bells car park.

Mrs.Dalton had written away for catalogues but not yet received them.

(b) Old Burial Ground Wall.

Mr.A.C.Hales had informed the Clerk that he hoped to commence the re - pointing towards the end of September.

(c) Walled Tree Bed in High St.

The Clerk had made an appointment for the Committee Chairman and himself to meet the builders on the proposed site that evening at 7.30 p.m.

(d) Cullam Rd. recreation ground swings.

The parts to repair these had been received but not yet fitted.

(e) Proposed bus shelter for London Rd.

The Clerk had obtained the plan, from the County Council, of the shelters erected at Sandhills but no specifications had been included. The Clerk to obtain these and then put the building of the shelter out to tender.

(f) Litter Bins.

Reply received from the District Council Chief Technical Officer stating that he considered the number requested (18) was excessive, and many of the proposed sites unsuitable. His Superintending Foreman had recommended that nine be supplied and listed, what he considered, suitable sites.

Resolved. That the Chief Technical Officer's recommendations be agreed.

(g) Litter Notices.

Chairman of the School Managers

The Chairman said he had not yet contacted Mr. Evans regarding the fixing of a plate on the Primary School wall.

Mr.Audley Miller said, that as a ~~School Governor~~, he could, and did, give the required permission.

The Clerk said that, in view of the amount of rubbish dumped in the lane extending from the east end of Roman Road, perhaps a plate should be erected in that area.

Mr. Audley Miller said the District Council should be approached to erect a notice similar to the one erected in Crown Square.

Par.2. CORRESPONDENCE.

Tree Planting Grants - Season 1977/78

Letter received, from the District Council, regarding the above.

Resolved. That a grant be applied for towards the cost of six Lime trees to be planted along the western side of Church Road recreation ground and a tree to be planted on the village green at Littleworth.

The Clerk said he had been offered, by Mr.Baber of 14, Barlow Close, a 4 ft. Chestnut tree. Agreed that the Chairman and Clerk call and see the tree to ascertain if it could be utilised.

PAR.2.

CORRESPONDENCE.

Letter received from Mrs. Margaret Forster complaining that the footpath to the Windmill, from Littleworth, was impassable. Agreed that the Clerk answer her letter and ask the Fieldpath Society for assistance. Mr. Turrell said that, meanwhile, he would make an attempt to clear the path.

PAR.3.

AMENITY AREAS.

The discussion regarding these was postponed until the next Meeting when Mr. Blake said he would supply a village map.

PAR.4.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

- (a) Councillor Audley Miller gave details of a proposal, by the County Council, to plant trees and shrubs in the Littleworth Cutting before handing it over to the Parish Council.
- (b) Councillor ^{Brook's} Blake said, in regard to the Area Surveyor's letter stating that the widening of the footpath adjacent to the Post Office would be considered for assessment for next years programme, the footpath by Pound Cottage, in Church Rd., should also be considered. The Clerk to notify the Area Surveyor to this effect.
- (c) The Clerk said that complaints had been made regarding smell from, and pollution of, the Brook by sewage. Having confirmed that the complaint was justified he had notified the District Council. They had considerable difficulty in clearing the blockage which was traced eventually to the Beech Rd. area.

Also concerning the Brook, the Clerk reported that the undergrowth had been sprayed and killed.
- (d) The Clerk referred to the state of the grass in the recreation grounds. This was due to the delay, by Messrs. Turners of Wheatley, in repairing a minor break down of the mower due to lack of spares.
Mr. Warland had kept the grass in the Old Burial Ground cut by using a mower he had borrowed. The Clerk said he considered that Mr. Warland should be recompensed for his out of pocket expenses and suggested he be paid the sum of two pounds.
- (e) Councillor Blake said Mr. Warland had complained to him regarding the difficulty he experienced in keeping the grass cut in the Old Burial Ground to his satisfaction and asked that the Parish Council consider the possibility of purchasing a 'Flymo' mower which, apart from being more suitable for the Old Burial Ground, would act as a standby in the event of breakdown of the motor mower.
- (f) Agreed that the next areas to be considered for tree planting should be;
 - 1. High St. Village Green - Two Silver Birches at £15 each.
 - 2. Grass area opposite Jackies Lane - Three ^{Prunus} ~~Prunus~~ Avium F/I2/I at £17 each.

There being no further business the Chairman declared the Meeting Closed.

and signed.

Amendment. Paragraph I(g). That the words 'a School Governor' be replaced

MATTERS ARISING THEREFROM.

(a) Purchase of trees.

Mrs.Dalton had visited a Tree Nursery and ordered, subject to written
confirmation, the following;

- One Plane Tree at £18.50 for planting in the Merry Bells Car Park.
- One Whitebeam Tree at £17.50 for planting in the High St. tree bed.
- Two Horse Chestnut Trees at £17.50 each for Littleworth Green.
- Six Lime Trees at £19.50 each for Church Rd. Recreation Ground.

Agreed that the Clerk confirm the order and request delivery early in
the Tree Planting season and that at least fourteen days notice be
given before delivery. That an appropriate number of stakes and ties
be also ordered.

Mrs.Dalton would consider the matter of suitable protection for the
trees.

Agreed that a 'Planting' sub - committee be formed consisting of
Councillors J.Brooks, Mrs.Dalton and F.A.Rooney with authority to
co - opt further members.

(b) Recreation Grounds Equipment.

The painting of Church Rd. rec. equipment had been completed.
It had been necessary to paint parts of the Slide three times; the
second time after it had been badly scratched before the paint had
hardened and again after it had been sprayed with aluminium paint.

The swings in Cullam Rd. rec. would shortly be repaired and the
equipment painted.

(c) Proposed 'bus shelter for London Rd.

Councillor Blake and the Clerk had met Mr.Woods of the County Architect's
Department on the site and he had arranged for his Department to supply
copies of plans which had been received.

Agreed that the Clerk obtain tenders for the work and submit a copy of
the plan to the County Surveyor for approval.

(d) Litter Bins. The Clerk had received no reply, to date, from the District
Council.

(e) Barrier for Tin Pan Alley.

The Clerk had approached Mr. Powell for an estimate but had not yet
received same.

MATTERS ARISING THEREFROM.

(a) Purchase of trees.

Receipt of the order, by the Estate Office. Elenheim Palace, had now
been confirmed.

Mrs.Dalton had made enquiries regarding suitable guards.

Agreed that the Clerk ascertain the cost of 50 lengths of timber to
enable guards to be made.

Agreed, at Mr.Audley Miller's suggestion, that the Clerk write to
Miss Tassell of the County Council Planning Dept. requesting that an
expert attend a meeting with the Parish Council Members to give
instruction on tree planting.

Mrs.Dalton agreed to contact the Nursery regarding insurance, which
was believed to be available, in the event that a tree did not
survive the first year.

(b) London Rd. Bus Shelter.

Two tenders had been received;

'P & B' Constructions..... £585.00

K.H.Woodward..... £684.58

The Clerk said he had not yet received the approval of the County
Surveyor.

Resolved. That Council be recommended to accept the tender of 'P & B'
Constructions subject to the approval of the County
Surveyor.

(c) Litter Bins.

Noted that these had now been received and positioned.

The Clerk said he had received the account in the sum of £5.32 each,
a total of £47.88

As it was understood that the District Council would pay half the
cost the Clerk was instructed to query the account.

(d) Amenity Areas.

As Mr. Blake was not present the promised map was not available.

The Clerk said that at the last Meeting, and under this heading,
Mrs.Quarterman had proposed that Mr.G.Evans be approached regarding
the possible use of the Primary School playground, on Saturday
mornings, by youngsters wishing to 'skateboard'.

The Clerk had written to Mr.Evans and had received a reply. This stated
that if one parent approached Mr.Evans and completed the necessary forms
to form a club, the playground could be hired from the County Council
for 50p an hour. A parent would have to be on duty during the period
of use.

Mr.Audley Miller said that the use of the playground would come under
the Sports Field Agreement and the matter could be passed to the Committee.
This was agreed.

(e) Recreation Ground Equipment.

In answer to Mrs. Dalton, the Clerk said he understood that the new equipment for Cullam Rd. recreation ground had been fitted but he had not yet checked it. Mrs. Dalton said she would do so. The Clerk referred to the two damaged seats in Church Rd. ground. He suggested that one could be repaired with metal box girders but the other one bore a 'Coronation' plaque and should, therefore, be repaired with wood. Agreed to recommend to Council that this be done.

(f) Littleworth/Windmill Footpath.

Mr. Turrell said he had cleared about two hundred yards of this path and would continue to clear the rest. Agreed that, in the Spring, the Headmaster of Wheatley Park School be asked that the children, when on cross country runs, use the footpaths and thereby help to keep them open.

(g) Purchase of a 'Flymo' type mower.

Agreed to leave consideration of this until the Spring. Enquiries then be made regarding the advantages of purchasing one through the County Council Consortium.

(g) Purchase of additional trees.

Mrs. Dalton wished to obtain further details of suitable species of Prunus Avium and the prices. Agreed that to enable the Committee to plant trees on High St. village green the Clerk approach the Southern Electricity Board regarding the possible removal of the pole thereon.

- (c) Recreation Ground seats. The Clerk said that he had arranged for Mr. Don Jones to examine the seats in Church Rd, rec. and inform him if he was prepared to repair them. Mrs.Dalton referred to the condition of Park Hill seat. The Clerk said he would ask Mr. Jones to also report on this.
- (d) Agreed that the Clerk approach the District Council for permission to plant a tree in the grass forecourt of Windows Court.

Par.2. CORRESPONDENCE.

Letter from the District Council Chief Planning Officer re 1977/78 Tree Grant and conditions relating to same. Agreed that the Clerk make application for a grant.

Par.3. ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

The Clerk to approach the District Planning Authorities to confirm that Messrs. Bloor will carry out the landscaping, as per their planning application, during the current planting season.

Mr.Blake referred to the amount of rubbish blown into High St, from the adjacent shops. Agreed that the Chamber of Trade be asked to bring this up at their next Meeting.

Mr.Blake said he had been approached by two boys who were prepared to clear up rubbish in the centre of the village for a small remuneration. Agreed that the Clerk ascertain if the grant for litter collection, offered some time ago by the District Council, was still available.

There being no further business the Chairman declared the Meeting closed.

Minutes of the Meeting held 23rd. November 1977, which had been previously circulated, were approved and signed.

Par.I MATTER ARISING THEREFROM.

- (a) Tree Planting. Mrs. Dalton reported that 14 trees had now been planted in the following positions;

6 in Church Road recreation ground.
2 on the village green at Littleworth.
1 in the walled bed in High St.
1 in the Merry Bells Car Park.
3 on the grass area in Crown Rd. opposite Jackies Lane.
1 in the grass forecourt of Windows Court.

Two Birch trees were still to be delivered and these, when received, would be planted on the village green in High St.

Agreed that the Clerk should make application, to the District Council, for a Tree Grant.

Mrs. Dalton had informed the ^{COUNTY}~~District~~ Council that she had 20 small chestnut trees and six small oaks available. The ^{COUNTY}~~District~~ Council had informed the Clerk to this effect and suggested sites in London Rd.

It was decided that a more suitable site would be to use the trees, in view of their size, at the rear of the Jackies Lane Allotments car parking area to establish a tree nursery.

- (b) Landscaping of Bloors Development - Ladder Hill.

The Clerk said he had received no reply to his letter, dated 3rd. December, to the Planning Authorities regarding this.
Agreed that he again write.

- (c) London Rd. Bus Shelter

The Clerk had submitted plans of the proposed bus shelter, to the County Surveyor, on the 5th. October. Having received no reply he had again written on the 30th. November but had still received no reply.
Agreed that he now telephone the County Surveyor regarding the delay.

- (d) Amenity Areas. The Clerk drew the Meeting's attention to the Minutes of the of the Policy Advisory Committee of the District Council dated 6th. December 1977. It was recommended therein that; ' local councils be asked to accept responsibility for maintaining amenity areas on private housing estates..... that where the District Council be specifically asked to do so it be done on a re - chargeable basis'.

Proposed that the Clerk write to the Templars Close Residents Association and suggest that they plant the grass area there with trees and shrubs.

The Chairman said he wished to offer the Committee's thanks to Mrs.Dalton, who was unable to attend the Meeting, for the considerable work she had done in drawing up and presenting the Scheme.

5. "Access for the Disabled". Agreed that suggestions be invited from residents in the next issue of the 'Newsletter'.

6. Proposed London Rd. Bus Shelter. The Clerk had now received replies from the various bodies with undertakings in the vicinity of the proposed site. Agreed he now approach the selected builders.

In view of Mr. Warland's complaint of the damage being done to the grass, rose trees and plants it was agreed to recommend the replacement of the damaged gate with a solid wooden one. The Clerk to obtain estimates for so doing, and also ascertain the nearest 'pick up' point for a water supply.

- 3. Provisional Map & Statements of Public Rights of Way.

As there appeared to be no alterations in the footpaths shown the Map was accepted without comment.

CORRESPONDENCE.

- (a) Letter received from Mrs.Sorrel Thomas of 11, High St. expressing her delight at the number of trees being planted in Wheatley and, in particular, on the High St. village green. She asked, however, that as this green belonged to the village, something be done to prevent cars parking thereon.

The Committee agreed to look into the possibility of defining the area of the High St. village green and the possibility of limiting vehicular access.

- (b) The Clerk had received a telephone inquiry from Mrs. Walker of 13, Kelly's Rd. asking if the Elm trees cut down, at the end of the Kelly's Rd. cul - de - sac, could be replaced. The County Council had, she said, cut them down.

Mr. Audley Miller said he would view the site and report back.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

Agreed to discuss a Tree Planting Scheme for the 1978/79 planting season. Agreed that the Clerk arrange for the two trees adjacent to 115, High St. to be pollarded and the suckers removed.

There being no further business the Chairman declared the Meeting closed.
