WHEATLEY PARISH COUNCIL

MINUTES of the Meeting of the Open Spaces Committee, held at 7.30p.m. on Wednesday 18th July 1984, at the Merry Bells.

PRESENT: Councillors E. Molloy (Chairman), K. Bannister, M. Wake, and J. Wilkinson.

APOLOGIES were received from Councillors C. Dalton and G. Young.

1. MINUTES. The Minutes of the meeting held on 20th June 1984, which had previously been circulated, were approved and signed by the Chairman.

1.1. Matters arising.

1.1.1. Cullum Road Recreation Ground. The provision of play equipment was discussed. It was agreed that efforts should be made to form a group of Cullum Road residents who would be interested in the project. Mr. Molloy agreed to submit a notice, asking interested residents to contact him, to the Clerk for inclusion in the next New Letter.

The use of logs and tyres was suggested and the possibility of obtaining these is to be explored. Also the existing swings need to be cut and welded. It was reported that the equipment needed will cost £4.40 per day to hire. It was agreed to put the work needed as soon as possible so that it can be used in the good weather. It was agreed that the gravel needed for the path will now be delivered on 28th July, at a cost of £59.60.

1.1.2. Church Road Recreation Ground. An estimate of £230.00 (+ V.A.T.) had been received from 'Just Jobbing' for alterations to the recreation ground's entrance. It was agreed to submit this estimate, together with one from Mr. Wallis for repairs to the wall (£30), to the Finance Committee for consideration.

1.1.3. Holiday Entitlement. It was agreed that Mr. Davis should receive 4 weeks paid holiday per year. Two weeks should be taken in the summer months and two after 1st November and before 1st April.

1.1.4. Toilets and tree area. Planting is due to start on 1st September, subject to Mr. Clitheroe's final approval.

1.1.5. Employees. Mr. T. Tonks has replaced Mr. J. Marlowe on the Parish Council's part-time staff. He can be contacted on Wheatley 2830.

1.1.6. Seats. There have been several requests from local residents that the seat at the Farm Close Recreation Ground be retained, and it was agreed to return the seat there after repairs had been carried out.

It had been reported by Mr. Jones that the Farm Close Recreation Ground is badly fouled by dogs, many of whom come from the houses adjacent. It was agreed that a letter should be sent to each household in the section of Farm Close Road involved, asking dog owners not to exercise their dogs on the children's play area and explaining the dangers. It was also felt that the Parish Council should consider instituting its own Bye-Law to prevent dogs being exercised on the recreation grounds.

New seats are also to be sited at the toilet area and at Cullum House.

1.1.7. Road Markings in Crown Square. Mr. & Mrs. Garrod had written to the Parish Council to outline the problems they were experiencing with refuse lorries attempting to negotiate the corner of the High Street and Friday Lane. It was agreed to forward their comments to the District Council.

1.1.8. 46 High Street. The Wheatley Society is investigating the situation with regard to this property, and Councillor Vaughton agreed to report back to the next meeting.

1.1.9. Muddy Lane. Dumping of bricks and concrete is still taking place in Muddy Lane. It appears that whoever is responsible has a key for access. It

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2. Farm Close Patio. Attention was drawn to the neglected state of the Farm Close Patio. The area is badly overgrown with weeds and needs resurfacing; in addition the roses planted in memory of Mr. Jackson need watering if they are to survive.
3. Church Road Recreation Ground. A recent incident involving threats with broken bottles had drawn attention once again to problems of vandalism and violence at the recreation ground. It was felt that the police should be asked to keep the area under observation.
4. Footpath between Church Road and London Road. It was agreed to make sure that the existing footpath, along the edge of the old allotment site, is not lost when development takes place on this site.
5. BMX Course. A BMX Course has been created on the land belonging to British Rail, behind Farm Close Recreation Ground.
6. Tree Planting Grants. It was agreed that the Parish Council should apply for grants for trees to be planted in the new toilet area and at the Church Road Recreation Ground.
7. Allotments -Keydale Road. It was recommended that these allotments should be advertised in the Newsletter.
8. Footpath between Station Road and Farm Close Road. A request that this footpath be cleared of weeds had been received. Mr. Molloy reported that the work had recently been carried out.
9. 46 Beech Road. The footpath outside this address is badly overgrown with weeds and plants from the garden. Complaints have been received, and it was requested that the path be cleared.
10. Lights. Oxfordshire County Council had agreed to supply four new lights in August 1983. None had yet been installed. The Clerk agreed to investigate.

There being no further business, the meeting closed at 9p.m.

HEATLEY PARISH COUNCIL

MINUTES of the Meeting of the Open Spaces Committee held on Wednesday 19th September 1984, at 7.30p.m., at the Ferry Bells.

PRESENT: Councillors J. Polloy (Chairman), K. Gannister, C. Dalton, W. Wake, J. Wilkinson, M. Young.

1. MINUTES. The minutes of the meeting held on 12th July 1984 were approved and signed by the Chairman, subject to the following amendment: Min.1.1.4. to read, "Planting is due to start in September in co-operation with Mr. Clitherow."

1.1. Matters arising.

- 1.1.1. Cullum Road Recreation Ground. It was reported that Mr. ~~Harris~~ ^{WATTS} has agreed to help by cutting trees to the sizes required for the play equipment, It was asked how the group of residents which was to be formed would differ from the group set up last year. The Chairman replied that the new group was to be more of a fund-raising group, sharing responsibility for expenditure with the Parish Council.

The Chairman submitted a plan for the gate and fencing. In discussion it was pointed out that the gates needed to keep motorcyclists out, and it was finally agreed to recommend that estimates be sought for the gates. It was decided that one entrance at each end (A&C on the plan submitted) should be closed and gates provided at the other two entrances. The Chairman agreed to supply the Clerk with the measurements of the different accesses. It was further agreed that estimates should be sought for a chain-link fence across the middle of the field.

Councillor Wilkinson offered a gate for opening D on the plan, and it was agreed that this would be delivered to Mrs. Bates House for trial.

- 1.1.2. Church Road Recreation Ground. It had been noted that the state of the ground near the gate is very bad, and it was recommended that gravel be purchased to fill in the ruts.

- 1.1.3. It was noted that South Oxfordshire District Council had agreed to provide grants for the introduction of safety surfaces in children's play areas. It was recommended that a quotation for the necessary work in our recreation grounds should be obtained, and a subsequent approach should be made to SOCD.

- 1.1.4. Dogs on recreation grounds. Locking the gate at nightfall had proved ineffective and it was agreed to write to the one persistent dog owner who misuses the Church Road Recreation Ground. It was also agreed that the Environmental Health Officer should be approached about the possibility of a Bye-law.

- 1.1.5. Street Cleaning. It was requested that Station Road, from Simons Close to the High Street, should be included in the street cleaning schedule. The Clerk was also requested to make a further approach to South Oxfordshire District Council about the fact that litter bins are still not emptied on Fridays, when dustbins are emptied.

- 1.1. 6 Crown Square. There had not been any reply about the road markings here;

- 1.1. 7.46 High Street. It was reported that Mrs. Baker is aware of the parish Council's concern about the state of this property, but can do little until her father's estate is settled.

- 1.1.8. Farm Close Patio. It was agreed to recommend that Mr. K. Banks should be asked for an estimate of the cost of removing the raised patio and making the area good with topsoil.
- 1.1.9. Keydale Road Allotments. It was agreed that a notice should be included in the next edition of the Newsletter asking anyone interested in renting one of these allotments to contact the Clerk, and reminding existing holders that rents are due.
- 1.1.10. Lights. The County Council has no trace of the order for street lighting, cf. Minutes of the meeting of 3rd January 1984. It was therefore agreed to reorder the lights as follows: 1. Outside Mr. Turner's shop, subject to Mr. Turner agreeing to the light being suspended from his building.

2. Corner of Old London Road and London Road.

3. Corner of Jackie's Land and Crown Road.

4. Corner of Crown Road and Mulberry Drive.

It was also agreed to make enquiries about the possibility of one light being provided free of charge, as recorded in the Minutes of the meeting of 6th February 1984. *By Cramphoms.*

2. TOILETS AND TREE AREA. The Chairman reported that he had tried to lift the paving stones, but they were very deeply embedded. Mr. Clitherow had offered to help, but it was suggested that the scheme might be deferred until the District Council has completed the work inside the building. It might then be possible to ask their workmen to lift the stones, and there would be no danger of the new beds and trees being spoilt during the work taking place inside the building.

The problem of storage generally had also been highlighted during the work on the site. The Parish Council has no central place for storage of machinery or materials, and no means of transporting materials from one site to another. It was suggested that Councillor Molloy's garage could become a central storage place for the moment, as the Parish Council now pays rent for the building. It was also recommended that the Parish Council considers the possibility of purchasing a small truck for use with the tractor.

3. ORGANISATION OF STAFF AND EQUIPMENT. It was strongly recommended that an inventory of all equipment, tools and materials be drawn up, together with an indication of their current storage place. It was recommended that the Chairman should compile this inventory, and that the Clerk should compile a report of the work done by part-time employees, the hours spent, and the cost involved. These items will then be discussed at the next meeting of the Amenities Committee.

4. ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

- 4.1. Christmas Tree. It was recommended that a Christmas Tree should be grown in the toilet area. It was further recommended that a tree be provided outside The Merry Bells again this year, and that this year the lights should be bought rather than rented hired as the costs are comparable. The tree is usual ordered from Magdalen College in November. *E. Molloy*

- 4.2. Clean-Up. South Oxfordshire District Council has given advanced notice of its intention to conduct a Clean-Up Campaign again next March. *24/10/84*

- 4.3. Car Park, Church Road. It was reported that the wall to the car park is falling.

MINUTES of the meeting of the Open Spaces Committee held on Wednesday 24th October 1974, at 7,30p.m. at the Merry Bells.

PRESENT: Councillors E. Polloy (Chairman), K. Bannister, C. Dalton, B. Wake, J. Wilkinson.

AGREEMENTS were received from Councillor T. Young.

MINUTES. The Minutes of the meeting held on 19th September 1974 were approved and signed by the Chairman.

1.1. Matters Arising.

1.1.1. Cullum Road Recreation Ground. The Clerk had obtained estimates for the provision of gates and fencing at the above recreation ground. Two eight foot wide gates, with posts, and 25 metres of chain link fencing, with the ten posts which would be needed would cost just under £500.00. In addition the County Council's Bulk Purchasing Unit had been approached and had agreed to negotiate a 12½% reduction on the goods with URM. It was agreed that detailed written estimates should be obtained and submitted to the County Council so that negotiations can commence, in spite of the uncertain situation with regard to the lease of the recreation ground. If the lease is to be renewed the gated and fencing needed will be ready. The Committee was, however, mindful of the fact that URM might ultimately be responsible for the provision and upkeep of the boundaries.

1.1.2. Church Road Recreation Ground. Gravel had been purchased and delivered.

1.1.3. Safety Surfaces. Wicksteed's representative is to visit the recreation ground and prepare an estimate for the work needed.

1.1.4 Toilet Area. The paving stones around the raised bed have now been lifted and the ground prepared for sowing.

FARM CLOSE PATIO. The Clerk had received a petition from residents of Farm Close Road objecting to the proposals to remove the raised patio and provide a grassed area. The residents fear that any plans for change would involve the loss of the trees, which are much appreciated, and that a grassed area would encourage noisy and dangerous children's games, and might become a car parking area. The Committee felt that in the light of these objections the area should be left as it is, but that a way to improve the broken and overgrown surface of the raised area should be sought. It was also recommended that the Village Produce Association should be approached with a request for guidance and possibly for plants and practical help in improving and maintaining the area.

It was finally recommended that residents living around the patio area should be asked for their suggestions of ways to improve the patio bearing in mind that the area is difficult to maintain in its present form, and that the Parish Council is concerned about the crumbling perimeter walls and the surface.

PLANNING FOR THE NEXT TWO AND A HALF YEARS. Suggestions for an agenda, to be submitted to the Finance and General Purposes Committee for consideration at its meeting of 29th October 1984:

1. Consideration should be given to possible ways of improving library facilities.
2. The Parish Council's links with other committees, such as the Merry Bells Management Committee and the Sports Field Management Committee, should be considered, and future involvement and representation of the Parish Council discussed.
3. It was felt that the Parish Council should produce an Information Handbook about services available to the public.
4. Planning Policies should be formed, and the creation of Conservation Areas examined.
5. The provision of a nature reserve on the old railway line should be pursued.
6. Community Education will be transformed in the next 2½ years and it is envisaged that the Parish Council will be involved.
7. The Parish Council will also, it is hoped, continue to press for improved traffic control in the village, to protect public transport provision, and to improve the facilities on the recreation grounds.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

- 4.1. Seat in Old Road. The seat is still in need of repair, and requires a slat of metal sectional girder.
- 4.2. Road Surfaces. The road edging is badly broken in Littleworth Road from the entrance to Littleworth Mobile Homes Estate to the Horspath turning.
The surface in Church Road has also been left uneven after repairs to gas pipe
- 4.3. It was felt that an estimate should be obtained for the burial ground wall in Station Road, which is breaking. *Where? Just above Chip Shop.*
- 4.4. Concern was expressed about the narrowness of Roman Road after recent kerbing replacement. Lorries and cyclists both use the road and it is felt that the narrowness and very high kerbs give cyclists no room for avoiding vehicles.

MINUTES of the meeting of the Open Spaces Committee held on Wednesday 21st November 1984, at 7.30p.m. at the Merry Bells.

PRESENT: Councillors E.Molloy (Chairman), C.Dalton, M.Wake, J.Wilkinson, G.Young.

APOLOGIES WERE RECEIVED FROM Councillor K.Bannister.

.. MINUTES of the meeting of 24th October 1984, which had previously been circulated, were approved and signed by the Chairman.

1.1. Matters Arising.

1.1.1. Toilet Area. Councillor Dalton reported that she had hired a mini-skip which had taken the stones and rubble from the site, and she asked if the Committee agreed to reimbursing her half the cost of the skip hire, which would be £7.50. This was agreed.

The problems experienced in moving heavy items led to discussion of the possibility of purchasing a trailer to use with the Wheelhorse, and the Clerk was asked to find out the cost of this.

It was decided that the next part of the improvements should be left until early spring, when topsoil would be needed and should be delivered direct to the site. A skip would also be required.

1.1.2. Wheelhorse Mower. It was recommended that the mower should be sent to Turneys for a service, and then returned to the Parish Council's garage until early spring. Andy Costar, of Tiddington, could also be approached for an estimate for the work.

1.1.3. Farm Close Patio. It was reported that a model is being made of possible improvements to the site.

1.1.4. Traffic Problems. The opinion was expressed that insufficient parking tickets were being issued; only three had been issued by P.C. Atkins during the first week of November. Holloway and the corner of Church Road should again be reported to the police at Cowley. There is a fear that congestion along Church Road, especially outside the Surgery, could lead to the withdrawal of bus services.

It was felt that as a matter of policy planning considerations should take into account the provision of adequate parking. It was noted that the Sandpiper had closed its car park, and asked what the response of the planning department would be to this move.

It was also pointed out that a double decker bus is regularly parked along Roman Road, near Elton Crescent, at night, and is damaging the grass verge severely. It was recommended that this should be reported to Mr. Turrill.

1.1.5. Footpaths. A letter had been received which requested that the footpath linking Station Road with Farm Close Road should be put into firm and clean order, and ~~that the continuation of the~~ be made comparable to the continuation of the path to Mulberry Drive. This request also should be communicated to Mr. Mr. Turrill.

MINUTES of the meeting of the Open Spaces Committee, held on Wednesday 12th December 1984, in the Council Chamber of the Merry Bells.

PRESENT: Councillors E.Molloy (Chairman), M.Wake, J.Wilkinson, G.Young.
K.Bannister and C.Dalton.

1. MINUTES of the meeting of 21st November 1984, which had previously been circulated, were approved and signed by the Chairman.

1.1. Matters Arising.

1.1.1. Traffic problems. It was made clear that in remarking on the number of parking tickets issued in the village at the last meeting, members were really questioning the general policy of the police in this respect. It was reported that a new Community Police Officer has been appointed and will begin his work in Wheatley on 14th January 1985. It was recommended that a meeting of the Traffic Committee be called, to look particularly at the problems in Church Road, near to both Holloway Road and Friday Lane.

It was further recommended that the Area Surveyor should be asked to consider making the area opposite the doctor's surgery in Church Road into a parking area.

It was suggested that South Oxfordshire District Council should be asked to provide a light in the Church Road car park, as residents in Church Road would be more inclined to use this car park overnight if they felt that their cars were less likely to be vandalised there.

It was also pointed out that there might be a possibility of rear access being obtained to the Church Road cottages from the new development of houses in Church Road. The householders involved should be reminded of this, and it was also asked if this might be made a condition attached to planning permission for the site when the final application is made.

1.1.2. Toilet Area. Mr.Clitheroe had complained about the materials which are left against his wall. It was pointed out that such problems arise because the Parish Council has no means of moving things themselves. It was decided that the sand would be moved to Church Road Recreation Ground on Saturday morning, and it was hoped that the stones would be moved by the middle of next week, if someone could be found who wanted them.

It was recommended that the Finance Committee be asked to reconsider the provision of a trailer for use with the Wheelhorse, especially as it now seems that a suitable one could be purchased for £150.00.

1.1.3. Mower. It was recommended that this should be returned to the Parish Council's garage when Turney's had finished the service currently being carried out.

2. FOOTPATH BETWEEN AMBROSE RISE AND CROWN ROAD. A letter had been received from a resident in Ambrose Rise pointing out the muddy and rutted state of the footpath. It was agreed to contact Mr. Turril, the Area Surveyor, about the problem.

3. YOUNG VILLAGERS COMPETITION. Information had been received about the Competition, organised by the Oxfordshire Rural Community Council and the Oxford Diocesan Board for Social Responsibility. It was agreed to pass the information to the Youth Club, the Ecumenical Youth Group, Scouts and Guides and the schools.

4. ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

4.1. Planning. Councillor Wilkinson reported that the planning application for infilling at the Littleworth Mobile Homes Site had been refused, but had very nearly received planning permission, as South Oxfordshire District Council felt that the drainage problems could be adequately dealt with. Planning permission had been refused on the grounds that the development would be unsightly and unneighbourly.

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- 4.2. Littleworth. Residents in the cottages next to Powells Yard have for some years parked their cars on land to the rear of the properties. The owner of the land has now moved earth onto the site to raise the land to the level of the field adjacent, which he also owns, and has reduced the parking area, making manoeuvring of cars difficult. It was felt that as all the land is privately owned the matter is one to be dealt with by the individuals concerned.
- 4.3. Crown Road. Complaints about the height of the new kerbs were reiterated.
- 4.4. Refuse Sacks. Senior Citizens were having problems obtaining the black sacks which should be provided by Pritchards. It was agreed to enquire about the provision, and also to find out the situation about collection from rear doors. This information should then be put in the Newsletter.

APOLOGIES were received from Councillor K.Bannister.

1. MINUTES of the meeting of 12th December 1984, which had previously been circulated, were approved and signed by the Chairman.

1.1. Matters Arising.

1.1.1. Traffic Problems. It was reported that residents in the cottages in Church Road are discussing the possibility of obtaining rear access with the developers of the ^{School} site.

1.1.2. Crown Road. A camping van has been abandoned on the grass verge at the corner of Crown Road and Jackies Lane. It was agreed to report this, together with a car abandoned in Beech Road, to South Oxfordshire District Council.

2. YOUTH TRAINING SCHEME - COMMUNITY PROJECTS. It was agreed to send copies of this circular from South Oxfordshire District Council to all the Churches in Wheatley as they all need the kind of repair work which the scheme can offer. It was also agreed to write to South Oxfordshire District Council to ask how much supervision of projects they themselves can supply.

3. STREET LIGHTING. Street lights had been ordered as agreed in the Minutes of the Finance and General Purposes Committee meeting of 3rd January 1984.

4. RECREATION GROUNDS. It was agreed to install play equipment made from logs and pipes as soon as possible if these materials can be obtained ^{at a small} free of charge. It was also agreed that the Clerk should check the progress of the proposed repairs to the gate at the Church Road Recreation Ground.

5. STAFFING. It was agreed that the pattern of work for the summer months should be changed to two days a week, 9a.m. to 12 noon and 1p.m. to 4p.m.. This arrangement should start on 1st April, and Mr.Tonks is to be asked if he would like to continue the work.

66. ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

- 6.1. Litter Bins. It was reported that Pritchards still do not empty the litter bin on Park Hill, and it was recommended that a list of all litter bins in the parish should be sent to the firm via S.O.D.C..
- 6.2. TREES. Councillor Dalton reported that Paul Kingsman, a tree surgeon from Garsington, is prepared to cut back the trees at the Old Burial Ground and on the Green for £3 per hour. It was also requested that he look at the lime trees growing over the slide in the Church Road Recreation Ground.
- 6.3. Farm Close Road Footpath. It was also requested that Mr. Kingsman inspect the trees growing alongside this footpath as some are dying. It was resolved to recommend that the footpath be tidied this year.
- 6.4. RABBITS ON ALLOTMENTS. In response to a circular from Oxford City Council, which offered to help to control rabbit infestation, it was agreed that a reply should be sent saying that the present controls were adequate.

1. MINUTES of the meeting of 23rd January 1985 were approved and signed by the Chairman.

1.1. Matters Arising

1.1.1. Farm Close Road. It was reported that a car had been abandoned.

1.1.2. Lights. The lights ordered have still not been erected and it was agreed to check to see when this would be done.

It was reported that the street lamp on Park Hill outside 'Chestnuts' was swaying about in the wind and it was agreed to report this as well.

2. CHURCH ROAD RECREATION GROUND

It was agreed to enquire about the gate that needed to be repaired in Church Road and it was agreed to pursue this matter.

It was agreed to write to Mr R Clarke in the cottage next to the fish and chip shop in Station Road, with regard to walking his dog in the recreation ground every day and to point out that it was against the Bye-Laws.

It was also reported that the fence needs checking between Church Road and Templars Close.as it was falling down.

3. STAFF.

It was reported that Mr R Robinson was interested in the job of general Handyman although it was known that others might be interested also. It was suggested that repairs to the Fence could be one of the first jobs.

The Clerk was asked to check with Mr Davis when he would be having his holidays this year.

4. LITTER BINS

It was reported that the Litter Bins around the village are still not being emptied and it was agreed to report this to SODC yet again.

5. TREES

The Lime trees on Church Road Recreation Ground and the trees on the village green had now been trimmed.

6. RABBIT INFESTATION

It was agreed that there was no need to accept the City Councils offer to remove rabbits from the allotment land.

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2. The Wheelhorse. It was agreed to recommend to the Parish Council that it rescind its previous decision to house that Wheelhorse in Mr. Molloy's garage, and that it should in future be kept at Mulberry Court.
3. Grass Cutting. The areas now being cut by Mr. Jones are: the recreation grounds at Church Road, Cullum Road and Farm Close Road, Littleworth Green, Wheatley Green and the Old Burial Ground. Mr. Jones had also agreed to add the patch of grass beside the road in front of the Farm Close Patio. AS there was some difficulty in obtaining accounts for petrol only, Mr. Jones had also suggested that he pay for the petrol himself and was later reimbursed. The Committee therefore decided to recommend that Mr. Jones' payment per cut be increased from £20.00 to £30.00, and that this should include petrol and oil.
4. Equipment. As there was no longer any room for the Parish Council's barrow to be kept behind the new restaurant in the White Hart Clubroom, it was resolved to ask Mr. Parker if it can be kept in his garage.
5. Sports Field Management Committee. The site meeting to view the facilities administered by the Committee would now take place on Saturday 4th May, meeting at the Pavilion at 10a.m.

There being no other business the meeting closed at 8.35p.m.
